A RETIREMENT HOME YOU ARE CONSIDERING



Depending on the care you or your loved one needs, there are several questions you should ask a prospective retirement home. While you likely already have many questions about amenities and retirement living costs, the questions below can help start your conversations. The importance of each will depend on your unique situation and needs. These questions may not all be relevant for you but will outline some of the key things to consider and ask.

Q. Do you offer dementia care?*			
Q. Do you offer medication reminders?			
Q. If the care needs of a resident change, are there additional services available at this home?			
Q. How do you accommodate dietary restrictions?			
Q. What services do you offer? (i.e. parking, shuttle buses, religious services)
