Purpose of Inspection
The RHRA received a report under section 75(1) of the <i>Retirement Homes Act, 2010</i> (the "RHA").

NON-COMPLIANCE
<p>1. The Licensee failed to comply with the RHA, S.O. 2010, c. 11, s. 62; Involvement of resident, etc.. The Licensee failed to comply with O. Reg. 166/11, s. 47; Development of plan of care.</p> <p>Specifically, the Licensee failed to comply with the following subsection(s):</p> <p>62. (5) The licensee shall ensure that the resident, the resident's substitute decision-maker, if any, and any other persons designated by the resident or substitute decision-maker are given an opportunity to participate in the development, implementation and reviews of the resident's plan of care.</p> <p>47. (5) If an assessment of a resident indicates that the resident's care needs may include dementia care, skin and wound care or the use of a personal assistance services device, the licensee shall ensure that an interdisciplinary care conference is held as part of the development of the resident's plan of care and that the resident's plan of care takes into account the results of the care conference.</p> <p>47. (6) The licensee shall ensure that the resident, the resident's substitute decision-maker, if any, and any other person designated by the resident or the substitute decision-maker are given an opportunity to participate in the interdisciplinary care conference mentioned in subsection (5).</p>
<p>Inspection Finding</p> <p>At the time of the inspection, an interdisciplinary care conference had not taken place for a resident diagnosed with dementia. Further, there was no evidence the family had participated in the development of the plan of care nor in an interdisciplinary care conference.</p>
<p>Outcome</p> <p>At the time of the inspection, the Licensee was not in compliance. The home has since taken corrective</p>


action to achieve compliance.

NOTICE

The Final Inspection Report is being provided to the Licensee, the Registrar of the Retirement Homes Regulatory Authority (the "RHRA") and the home's Residents' Council, if any.
