

FINAL INSPECTION REPORT Under the *Retirement Homes Act, 2010*

Purpose of Inspection

The RHRA received a report under section 75(1) of the Retirement Homes Act, 2010 (the "RHA").

NON-COMPLIANCE

1. The Licensee failed to comply with O. Reg. 166/11, s. 56; Format and retention of records.

Specifically, the Licensee failed to comply with the following subsection:

<u>s. 56 (5)</u> In addition to subsection (4), if a record is a record that subsection 55 (1) requires the licensee to keep in respect of a resident of a retirement home, the licensee shall ensure that the record is retained for no less than seven years from the last day on which the person is a resident of the home and that a copy of the record is available in the home at all times during that period.

Inspection Finding

The Inspector confirmed that the Licensee failed to ensure the retention of a resident's chart. Despite repeated requests, the Licensee and staff of the home were unable to produce such a record, as is required by the legislation.

Outcome

The Licensee has taken corrective action to prevent future incidents relating to the retention of records.

2. The Licensee failed to comply with O. Reg. 166/11, s. 23; Behaviour management.

Specifically, the Licensee failed to comply with the following subsection:

<u>s. 23 (1)</u> Every licensee of a retirement home shall develop and implement a written behaviour management strategy that includes,

(a) techniques to prevent and address resident behaviours that pose a risk to the resident or others in the home;

(b) strategies for interventions to prevent and address resident behaviours that pose a risk to the resident or others in the home;

(c) strategies for monitoring residents that have demonstrated behaviours that pose a risk to the resident or others in the home; and

(d) protocols for how staff and volunteers shall report and be informed of resident behaviours that pose a risk to the resident or others in the home.

Inspection Finding

The Licensee has not developed and/or implemented a written behaviour management strategy, as is required by the legislation.

Outcome

Corrective action taken.

3. The Licensee failed to comply with O. Reg. 166/11, s. 32; Records.

Specifically, the Licensee failed to comply with the following subsection:

<u>s. 32</u> If the licensee or a member of the staff of a retirement home administers a drug or other substance to a resident, the licensee shall ensure that,

(a) the person who administered the drug or other substance prepares a written record noting the name and amount of the drug or other substance, the route of its administration and the time and date on which it was administered.

Inspection Finding

Home staff advised the Inspector that a resident had been administered a sleeping pill on January 30, 2013. The staff who administered the sleeping pill to the resident failed to prepare a written record of this administration, as is required by the legislation.

Outcome

Corrective action taken.



NOTICE

The Final Inspection Report is being provided to the Licensee, the Registrar of the Retirement Homes Regulatory Authority (the "RHRA") and the home's Residents' Council, if any.

Section 55 of the RHA requires that the Final Inspection Report be posted in the home in a conspicuous and easily accessible location. In addition, the Licensee must ensure that copies of every Final Inspection Report from the previous two (2) years are made available in the Home, in an easily accessible location.
