

# FINAL INSPECTION REPORT Under the *Retirement Homes Act, 2010*

#### **Purpose of Inspection**

The RHRA received a report under section 75(1) of the *Retirement Homes Act, 2010* (the "RHA").

### **NON-COMPLIANCE**

 The Licensee failed to comply with O. Reg. 166/11, s. 29; Administration of drugs or other substances. The Licensee failed to comply with O. Reg. 166/11, s. 30; Storage of drugs or other substances. The Licensee failed to comply with O. Reg. 166/11, s. 32; Records.

Specifically, the Licensee failed to comply with the following subsections:

**<u>s. 29.</u>** If one of the care services that the licensee or the staff of a retirement home provide to a resident of the home is the administration of a drug or other substance, the licensee shall ensure that,

(a) no drug is administered by the licensee or the staff to the resident in the home unless the drug has been prescribed for the resident by a person who is authorized to prescribe a drug under section 27 of the *Regulated Health Professions Act, 1991*.

**<u>s. 30.</u>** If drugs or other substances are stored in a retirement home on behalf of a resident, the licensee of the home shall ensure that,

(b) controlled substances as defined in the *Controlled Drugs and Substances Act* (Canada) are stored

- in a separate, double-locked area within the locked medication cart, and
- (c) an audit of the controlled substances mentioned in clause (b) is performed monthly.

**<u>s. 32.</u>** If the licensee or a member of the staff of a retirement home administers a drug or other substance to a resident, the licensee shall ensure that,

(a) the person who administered the drug or other substance prepares a written record noting the name and amount of the drug or other substance, the route of its administration and the time and date on which it was administered.



### **Inspection Finding**

The Licensee failed to comply with the standards relating to the administration of drugs or other substances, and to implement their Medication Administration policies. Specifically:

- A resident received Tylenol No. 2 that had not been prescribed by a Regulated Health Professional as required by the legislation;
- The controlled substance was not audited monthly and double-locked;
- There was no written record of the drug administration.

#### Outcome

No corrective action taken. Warning Letter issued.

#### 2. The Licensee failed to comply with O. Reg. 166/11, s. 22; Risk of falls.

Specifically, the Licensee failed to comply with the following subsections:

**<u>s. 22. (1)</u>** Every licensee of a retirement home shall develop, document and implement strategies to reduce or mitigate the risk of falls in common areas of the home.

(2) If a resident of a retirement home falls in a common area of the home or while being assisted by the licensee or staff, the licensee shall ensure that,

(a) there is a timely and appropriate response to the fall;

(b) corrective action is taken as necessary to prevent future harm to residents; or

(c) the licensee or a staff member documents the fall, the response to the fall and the corrective actions taken, if any.

(3) If a resident of a retirement home falls in the home in circumstances other than those described in subsection (2) and the licensee or staff member becomes aware of the fall, the licensee shall ensure that the licensee or a staff member documents the fall, the response to the fall and the corrective actions taken, if any.

#### **Inspection Finding**

A resident had three falls since May 2013. There was no documentation of the response to the falls and the corrective actions taken related to the falls. The Licensee also confirmed that the home has no fall strategies to reduce or mitigate the risk of falls.

#### Outcome

No corrective action taken.

Warning Letter issued.
