#### **Purpose of Inspection**

The RHRA conducts routine inspections as set out in section 77(3) of the Retirement Homes Act, 2010 (the "RHA").

#### NON-COMPLIANCE

# 1. The Licensee failed to comply with RHA, S.O. 2010, c. 11, s. 60 and O. Reg. 166/11, s. 24; Emergency plan, general

Specifically, the Licensee failed to comply with the following subsections:

## s. 24. (5) The licensee shall,

(a) On an annual basis at least, test the emergency plan, including arrangements with community agencies, partner facilities and resources that will be involved in responding to an emergency, related to,

- (ii) situations involving a missing resident,
- (iv) violent outbursts;
- (b) at least once every two years, conduct a planned evacuation of the retirement home.

#### **Inspection Finding**

The home has not tested the emergency plan, including arrangements with community agencies, partner facilities and resources that will be involved in responding to an emergency related to situations involving missing resident and violent outbursts.

The home's evacuation plan reads that every three years the home shall plan an evacuation.

#### Outcome

Corrective action scheduled to be completed by the Licensee by August 8, 2014.

# 2. The Licensee failed to comply with O. Reg. 166/11, s. 25; Emergency plan, retirement home with more than 10 residents

Specifically, the Licensee failed to comply with the following subsection:

#### s. 25. (3) The licensee shall ensure that the emergency plan provides for the following:

1. Dealing with,

(iii) violent outbursts,

(v) medical emergencies,

#### **Inspection Finding**

The home's emergency plan did not provide for dealing with violent outbursts and medical emergencies.

#### Outcome

Corrective action taken by the Licensee.

# 3. The Licensee failed to comply with RHA, S.O. 2010, c. 11, s. 60 and O. Reg. 166/11 s. 27; Infection prevention and control program

Specifically, the Licensee failed to comply with the following subsection:

<u>s. 60. (4)</u> Every licensee of a retirement home shall ensure that the following are in place for the home:2. An infection prevention and control program that meets the prescribed requirements.

**<u>s. 27. (4)</u>** The licensee of a retirement home shall ensure that a written surveillance protocol is established in consultation with the local medical officer of health or designate in order to identify, document and monitor residents who report symptoms of respiratory or gastrointestinal issues.

### **Inspection Finding**

The home did not establish a written surveillance protocol.

#### Outcome

Corrective action taken by the Licensee.

#### 4. The Licensee failed to comply with O. Reg. 166/11, s. 59; Procedure for complaints to licensee

Specifically, the Licensee failed to comply with the following subsections:

**<u>s. 59. (1)</u>** Every licensee of a retirement home shall ensure that every written or verbal complaint made to the licensee or a staff member concerning the care of a resident or operation of the home is dealt with as follows:

1. The complaint shall be investigated. If the complaint alleges harm or risk of harm to one or more



residents, the investigation shall be commenced immediately.

### **Inspection Finding**

The homes written complaints procedure failed to include that if the complaint alleges harm or risk of harm, the investigation shall be commenced immediately.

### Outcome

Corrective action taken by the Licensee.



# NOTICE

The Final Inspection Report is being provided to the Licensee, the Registrar of the Retirement Homes Regulatory Authority (the "RHRA") and the home's Residents' Council, if any.

Section 55 of the RHA requires that the Final Inspection Report be posted in the home in a conspicuous and easily accessible location. In addition, the Licensee must ensure that copies of every Final Inspection Report from the previous two (2) years are made available in the Home, in an easily accessible location.
