Purpose of Inspection
The RHRA conducts routine inspections as set out in section 77(3) of the <i>Retirement Homes Act, 2010</i> (the "RHA").

NON-COMPLIANCE
<p>1. The Licensee failed to comply with the RHA, S.O. 2010, c. 11, s. 54; Contents.</p> <p>Specifically, the Licensee failed to comply with the following subsection(s):</p> <p>54. (2) The package of information shall include, at a minimum,</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (k) an itemized list of the different types of accommodation and care services provided in the retirement home and their prices; (s) information as to whether the retirement home has automatic sprinklers in each resident's room; (t) information relating to staffing, including night time staffing levels and qualifications of staff of the retirement home;
<p>Inspection Finding</p> <p>The Licensee's CHIP did not contain the information for residents with respect to all prices; night time staffing or sprinklers.</p>
<p>Outcome</p> <p>Corrective action taken by the Licensee.</p>
<p>2. The Licensee failed to comply with O. Reg. 166/11, s. 24; Emergency plan, general. The Licensee failed to comply with O. Reg. 166/11, s. 25; Emergency plan, retirement home with more than 10 residents.</p>

Specifically, the Licensee failed to comply with the following subsection(s):

24. (5) The licensee shall,

- (a) on an annual basis at least, test the emergency plan, including arrangements with community agencies, partner facilities and resources that will be involved in responding to an emergency, related to,
 - (ii) situations involving a missing resident,
 - (iv) violent outbursts;

25. (2) The licensee shall ensure that the development of the emergency plan includes,

- (b) identification of hazards and risks that may give rise to an emergency affecting the home, whether the hazards and risks arise within the home or in the surrounding vicinity or community, and strategies to address those hazards and risks.

25. (3) The licensee shall ensure that the emergency plan provides for the following:

- 1. Dealing with,
 - ii. community disasters,
 - viii. loss of one or more essential services.
 - vi. chemical spills,
 - v. medical emergencies,

25. (5) The licensee shall ensure that the emergency plan for the retirement home is evaluated and updated at least annually and that the updating includes contact information for the relevant community agencies, partner facilities and resources that will be involved in responding to an emergency.

Inspection Finding

The Licensee had evidence of a written Emergency Plan but the plan did not provide for the elements as listed.

Outcome

Corrective action required by the Licensee.

3. The Licensee failed to comply with O. Reg. 166/11, s. 22; Risk of falls.

Specifically, the Licensee failed to comply with the following subsection(s):

22. (1) Every licensee of a retirement home shall develop, document and implement strategies to reduce or mitigate the risk of falls in common areas of the home.

Inspection Finding

The Licensee had a written falls strategy but the strategy had not been implemented and was not specific to the home.

<p>Outcome Corrective action required by the Licensee.</p>
<p>4. The Licensee failed to comply with O. Reg. 166/11, s. 27; Infection prevention and control program.</p> <p>Specifically, the Licensee failed to comply with the following subsection(s):</p> <p>27. (3) The licensee shall keep a written record of the consultation required under subsection (2) that shall include a record of when the consultation took place, what was discussed and any recommendations that the local medical officer of health or designate made.</p>
<p>Inspection Finding The Licensee did not have a written record of annual consultation with the Medical Officer of Health or their designate.</p>
<p>Outcome Corrective action required by the Licensee.</p>
<p>5. The Licensee failed to comply with O. Reg. 166/11, s. 44; Full assessment of care needs.</p> <p>Specifically, the Licensee failed to comply with the following subsection(s):</p> <p>44. (2) The full assessment mentioned in subsection (1) shall consider the following matters with respect to the resident:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Physical and mental health. 4. Behavioural issues. 5. Need for care services. 6. Need for assistance with the activities of daily living. 7. The matters listed in subsection 43 (2). 2. Functional capacity.
<p>Inspection Finding The Licensee had evidence of assessments being completed but the full assessment was not consistent for containing the required elements as listed.</p>
<p>Outcome Corrective action required by the Licensee.</p>
<p>6. The Licensee failed to comply with O. Reg. 166/11, s. 20; Food preparation.</p> <p>Specifically, the Licensee failed to comply with the following subsection(s):</p>

20. (4) The licensee shall ensure that whenever food is prepared in the retirement home, at least one person involved in preparing the food holds a current certificate in food handling from the local public health unit or has recently successfully completed a food handling training program equivalent to that offered by public health units.

Inspection Finding

There was no documented evidence of any cook at the home having a current Food Handler's certificate.

Outcome

Corrective action required by the Licensee.

7. The Licensee failed to comply with the RHA, S.O. 2010, c. 11, s. 65; Additional training for direct care staff.

Specifically, the Licensee failed to comply with the following subsection(s):

65. (5) The licensee shall ensure that all staff who provide care services to residents receive training in the following matters and at the times required by the regulations, as a condition of continuing to have contact with residents, in addition to the other training that they are required to receive under this section:

- 3. Behaviour management.

Inspection Finding

There was no evidence of training staff on Behaviour Management.

Outcome

Corrective action taken by the Licensee.

8. The Licensee failed to comply with O. Reg. 166/11, s. 23; Behaviour management.

Specifically, the Licensee failed to comply with the following subsection(s):

23. (1) Every licensee of a retirement home shall develop and implement a written behaviour management strategy that includes,

- (a) techniques to prevent and address resident behaviours that pose a risk to the resident or others in the home;
- (b) strategies for interventions to prevent and address resident behaviours that pose a risk to the resident or others in the home;
- (c) strategies for monitoring residents that have demonstrated behaviours that pose a risk to the resident or others in the home;
- (d) protocols for how staff and volunteers shall report and be informed of resident behaviours that pose a risk to the resident or others in the home.

23. (2) The licensee shall ensure that all staff who provide care services to residents are advised at the beginning of every shift of each resident whose behaviours require heightened monitoring because those behaviours pose a risk to the resident or others in the home.

Inspection Finding

The Licensee did not have evidence of a written Behaviour Management strategy for the home.

Outcome


Corrective action required by the Licensee.

NOTICE

The Final Inspection Report is being provided to the Licensee, the Registrar of the Retirement Homes Regulatory Authority (the "RHRA") and the home's Residents' Council, if any.

Section 55 of the RHA requires that the Final Inspection Report be posted in the home in a conspicuous and easily accessible location.
