Purpose of Inspection

The RHRA conducts compliance inspections as set out in section 77(1) of the *Retirement Homes Act, 2010* (the "RHA").

NON-COMPLIANCE

1. The Licensee failed to comply with the RHA, S.O. 2010, c. 11, s. 62; Persons who approve plans of care.

The Licensee failed to comply with O. Reg. 166/11, s. 43; Initial assessment of care needs. The Licensee failed to comply with O. Reg. 166/11, s. 47; Development of plan of care. The Licensee failed to comply with O. Reg. 166/11, s. 55; Contents of records.

Specifically, the Licensee failed to comply with the following subsection(s):

62. (9) The licensee shall ensure that the following persons have approved the plan of care, including any revisions to it, and that a copy is provided to them:

1. The resident or the resident's substitute decision-maker.

<u>43. (1)</u> Subject to section 45, no later than two days after a resident commences residency in a retirement home, the licensee of the home shall ensure that an initial assessment of the resident's immediate care needs is conducted.

47. (4) Subject to subsections (5) and (6), a plan of care for a resident is complete if the plan,

(b) sets out,

(iii) the names of the persons who participated in the development of the plan and whether the resident and his or her substitute decision-makers, if any, participated in the development of the plan;

(c) has been approved in accordance with subsection 62 (9) of the Act.

55. (2) The record for each resident shall include,

(b) if the resident was assessed for the purposes of developing the resident's plan of care, documentation of when the resident was assessed and by whom;

Inspection Finding

A compliance inspection was completed of the Licensee's prescribed resident care files. Inspection revealed that the most recent resident's care file did not demonstrate that the prescribed initial assessment of the resident's care needs had been completed within the prescribed time frame. Additionally the resident's prescribed plan of care and associated records did not demonstrate that the resident or other prescribed person had participated in the development of the plan of care or approved the plan of care.

Outcome

The Licensee took corrective action to achieve compliance.

The Final Inspection Report is being provided to the Licensee, the Registrar of the Retirement Homes Regulatory Authority (the "RHRA") and the home's Residents' Council, if any.
