Purpose of Inspection
The RHRA conducts routine inspections as set out in section 77(3) of the <i>Retirement Homes Act, 2010</i> (the "RHA").

NON-COMPLIANCE
<p>1. The Licensee failed to comply with the RHA, S.O. 2010, c. 11, s. 54; Contents.</p> <p>Specifically, the Licensee failed to comply with the following subsection(s):</p> <p>54. (2) The package of information shall include, at a minimum, (t) information relating to staffing, including night time staffing levels and qualifications of staff of the retirement home;</p>
<p>Inspection Finding</p> <p>The Licensee failed to ensure that the Information Package for residents include information relating to staffing, including night time staffing levels and qualifications of staff of the retirement home.</p>
<p>Outcome</p> <p>The Licensee took corrective action to achieve compliance.</p>
<p>2. The Licensee failed to comply with O. Reg. 166/11, s. 44; Full assessment of care needs.</p> <p>Specifically, the Licensee failed to comply with the following subsection(s):</p> <p>44. (2) The full assessment mentioned in subsection (1) shall consider the following matters with respect to the resident:</p> <p>5. Need for care services.</p>

Inspection Finding

The Licensee failed to ensure the full assessment included the need for care services.

Outcome

The Licensee took corrective action to achieve compliance.

3. The Licensee failed to comply with O. Reg. 166/11, s. 15; Policy of zero tolerance of abuse and neglect.

Specifically, the Licensee failed to comply with the following subsection(s):

15. (3) The policy to promote zero tolerance of abuse and neglect of residents described in subsection 67 (4) of the Act shall,

- (g) provide that the licensee of the retirement home shall ensure that,
 - (ii) at least once in every calendar year, an evaluation is made to determine the effectiveness of the policy and what changes and improvements are required to prevent further occurrences of abuse and neglect of residents,
 - (iii) the results of the analysis undertaken under subclause (i) are considered in the evaluation mentioned in subclause (ii),
 - (iv) the changes and improvements mentioned in subclause (ii) are promptly implemented,
 - (v) a written record of everything provided for in subclauses (ii) and (iv) and the date of the evaluation, the names of the persons who participated in the evaluation and the date that the changes and improvements were implemented is promptly prepared.

Inspection Finding

The Licensee policy to promote zero tolerance of abuse and neglect of residents failed to ensure the policy was evaluated annually, failed to determine the effectiveness of an evaluation, failed to implement any changes or provide a written record of those changes including dates of the evaluation, persons that participated and dates changes were implemented.

Outcome

The Licensee took corrective action to achieve compliance.

NOTICE

The Final Inspection Report is being provided to the Licensee, the Registrar of the Retirement Homes Regulatory Authority (the "RHRA") and the home's Residents' Council, if any.

Section 55 of the RHA requires that the Final Inspection Report be posted in the home in a conspicuous and easily accessible location.
