Purpose of Inspection
The RHRA received a report under section 75(1) of the <i>Retirement Homes Act, 2010</i> (the "RHA").


NON-COMPLIANCE
<p>1. The Licensee failed to comply with O. Reg. 166/11, s. 40; Provision of a meal.</p> <p>Specifically, the Licensee failed to comply with the following subsection(s):</p> <p>40. If one of the care services that the licensee or the staff of a retirement home provide to a resident of the home is the provision of a meal, the licensee shall ensure that,</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (a) if the licensee is the sole provider of the resident's meals, the resident is offered at least three meals per day at reasonable and regular meal hours, a beverage between the morning and midday meals, a snack and a beverage between the midday and evening meals and a snack and a beverage after the evening meal; (c) the menu is varied and changes daily; (e) the menu includes alternative entrée choices at each meal; (g) the resident is informed of his or her daily and weekly menu options; (i) food service workers and staff assisting the resident are aware of the resident's diet, special needs and preferences;
<p>Inspection Finding</p> <p>The homes cycle menu notes that snacks and/or beverages are served three times a day yet staff reported that snacks and beverages are served twice a day. The Licensee did not ensure that there is variety in the breakfast menu and that the menu includes alternative entrée choices at each meal. The residents are not informed of his or her daily or weekly menu options. Further, staff were not clear regarding diets for residents with diabetes.</p>
<p>Outcome</p> <p>The Licensee submitted plan to achieve compliance by July 27, 2016. RHRA to confirm compliance by inspection.</p>

NOTICE

The Final Inspection Report is being provided to the Licensee, the Registrar of the Retirement Homes Regulatory Authority (the "RHRA") and the home's Residents' Council, if any.
