Purpose of Inspection
The RHRA conducts routine inspections as set out in section 77(3) of the <i>Retirement Homes Act, 2010</i> (the "RHA").

NON-COMPLIANCE
<p>1. The Licensee failed to comply with the RHA, S.O. 2010, c. 11, s. 60; Safety plans. The Licensee failed to comply with O. Reg. 166/11, s. 27; Infection prevention and control program.</p> <p>Specifically, the Licensee failed to comply with the following subsection(s):</p> <p>60. (4) Every licensee of a retirement home shall ensure that the following are in place for the home:</p> <p>2. An infection prevention and control program that meets the prescribed requirements.</p> <p>27. (2) The licensee shall consult on an ongoing basis and not less than once a year with the local medical officer of health or designate about identifying and addressing health care issues in the retirement home in order to reduce the incidence of infectious disease outbreaks in the home.</p> <p>27. (3) The licensee shall keep a written record of the consultation required under subsection (2) that shall include a record of when the consultation took place, what was discussed and any recommendations that the local medical officer of health or designate made.</p>
<p>Inspection Finding</p> <p>The home's infection prevention and control program does not meet the prescribed requirements as listed.</p>
<p>Outcome</p> <p>The Licensee submitted plan to achieve compliance by November 28, 2016. RHRA to confirm compliance by inspection.</p>

- 2. The Licensee failed to comply with O. Reg. 166/11, s. 43; Initial assessment of care needs.
The Licensee failed to comply with O. Reg. 166/11, s. 44; Full assessment of care needs.**

Specifically, the Licensee failed to comply with the following subsection(s):

43. (2) The initial assessment mentioned in subsection (1) shall consider the following matters with respect to the resident:

- 7. Risk of harm to self and to others.

44. (2) The full assessment mentioned in subsection (1) shall consider the following matters with respect to the resident:

- 7. The matters listed in subsection 43 (2).

Inspection Finding

The licensee did not ensure that the initial and full assessments of resident care needs considered the requirements as listed.

Outcome

The Licensee has advised it has taken corrective action to achieve compliance. RHRA to confirm compliance by inspection.

- 3. The Licensee failed to comply with O. Reg. 166/11, s. 59; Procedure for complaints to licensee.**

Specifically, the Licensee failed to comply with the following subsection(s):

59. (2) The licensee shall ensure that a written record is kept in the retirement home that includes,
(c) the type of action taken to resolve the complaint, including the date of the action, time frames for actions to be taken and any follow-up action required;
(d) the final resolution, if any, of the complaint;
(e) every date on which any response was provided to the complainant and a description of the response;

Inspection Finding

The licensee did not ensure that the homes written complaints record includes the requirements as listed.

Outcome

The Licensee has advised it has taken corrective action to achieve compliance. RHRA to confirm compliance by inspection.

- 4. The Licensee failed to comply with O. Reg. 166/11, s. 22; Risk of falls.**

Specifically, the Licensee failed to comply with the following subsection(s):

22. (1) Every licensee of a retirement home shall develop, document and implement strategies to reduce or mitigate the risk of falls in common areas of the home.

22. (2) If a resident of a retirement home falls in a common area of the home or while being assisted by the licensee or staff, the licensee shall ensure that,

- (a) there is a timely and appropriate response to the fall;
- (b) corrective action is taken as necessary to prevent future harm to residents;
- (c) the licensee or a staff member documents the fall, the response to the fall and the corrective actions taken, if any.

22. (3) If a resident of a retirement home falls in the home in circumstances other than those described in subsection (2) and the licensee or a staff member becomes aware of the fall, the licensee shall ensure that the licensee or a staff member documents the fall, the response to the fall and the corrective actions taken, if any.

22. (4) Every licensee of a retirement home shall keep a written record of all falls for which the licensee is required to ensure documentation under subsection (2) or (3) and that occur in each year, evaluate the risk of falls in the home at least annually and keep a written record of each evaluation.

Inspection Finding

The licensee did not develop, document and implement strategies to reduce or mitigate the risk of falls as per the legislation.

Outcome


The Licensee has advised it has taken corrective action to achieve compliance. RHRA to confirm compliance by inspection.

The Final Inspection Report is being provided to the Licensee, the Registrar of the Retirement Homes Regulatory Authority (the "RHRA") and the home's Residents' Council, if any.

Section 55 of the RHA requires that the Final Inspection Report be posted in the home in a conspicuous and easily accessible location. In addition, the Licensee must ensure that copies of every Final Inspection Report from the previous two (2) years are made available in the Home, in an easily accessible location.
