

# FINAL INSPECTION REPORT Under the *Retirement Homes Act, 2010*

# **Purpose of Inspection**

The RHRA conducts compliance inspections as set out in section 77(1) of the *Retirement Homes Act, 2010* (the "RHA").

# **NON-COMPLIANCE**

# 1. The Licensee failed to comply with the RHA, S.O. 2010, c. 11, s. 54; Contents.

Specifically, the Licensee failed to comply with the following subsection(s):

#### 54. (2) The package of information shall include, at a minimum,

(c) the licensee's policy mentioned in subsection 67 (4) to promote zero tolerance of abuse and neglect of residents;

#### **Inspection Finding**

The Licensee did not ensure that the package of information contained the requirement listed.

#### Outcome

The Licensee submitted plan to achieve compliance by March 3, 2017. RHRA to confirm compliance by inspection.

#### 2. The Licensee failed to comply with O. Reg. 166/11, s. 27; Infection prevention and control program.

Specifically, the Licensee failed to comply with the following subsection(s):

**27. (2)** The licensee shall consult on an ongoing basis and not less than once a year with the local medical officer of health or designate about identifying and addressing health care issues in the retirement home in order to reduce the incidence of infectious disease outbreaks in the home.

**27. (3)** The licensee shall keep a written record of the consultation required under subsection (2) that shall include a record of when the consultation took place, what was discussed and any recommendations that the local medical officer of health or designate made.

# **Inspection Finding**

The licensee did not consult with Public Health in order to reduce the incidents of infectious disease outbreaks in the home, including keeping a written record of the consultation as per the legislative requirements.

#### Outcome

The Licensee has advised it has taken corrective action to achieve compliance. RHRA to confirm compliance by inspection.

3. The Licensee failed to comply with O. Reg. 166/11, s. 43; Initial assessment of care needs. The Licensee failed to comply with O. Reg. 166/11, s. 44; Full assessment of care needs.

Specifically, the Licensee failed to comply with the following subsection(s):

**43. (1)** Subject to section 45, no later than two days after a resident commences residency in a retirement home, the licensee of the home shall ensure that an initial assessment of the resident's immediate care needs is conducted.

**<u>43. (2)</u>** The initial assessment mentioned in subsection (1) shall consider the following matters with respect to the resident:

- 2. Presence of infectious diseases.
- 3. Risk of falling.
- 4. Known allergies.

**<u>44. (1)</u>** Subject to section 46, no later than 14 days after a resident commences residency in a retirement home, the licensee shall ensure that a full assessment of the resident's care needs and preferences is conducted.

**<u>44. (2)</u>** The full assessment mentioned in subsection (1) shall consider the following matters with respect to the resident:

7. The matters listed in subsection 43 (2).

#### **Inspection Finding**

The licensee did not complete all of the assessments that were reviewed at the inspection, in their entirety and therefore did not consider all of the requirements as listed. Further, the licensee did not date the assessments, therefore it cannot be determined if the assessments are being completed within the required time frame.

#### Outcome

The Licensee has advised it has taken corrective action to achieve compliance. RHRA to confirm compliance by inspection.



4. The Licensee failed to comply with the RHA, S.O. 2010, c. 11, s. 62; Contents of plan. The Licensee failed to comply with the RHA, S.O. 2010, c. 11, s. 62; Persons who approve plans of care.

The Licensee failed to comply with O. Reg. 166/11, s. 47; Development of plan of care.

Specifically, the Licensee failed to comply with the following subsection(s):

**62. (4)** The licensee of a retirement home shall ensure that there is a written plan of care for each resident of the home that sets out,

(a) the care services that are part of a package of care services that the resident is entitled to receive under the resident's agreement with the licensee, whether or not the resident receives the services;(d) a statement indicating whether the resident has provided consent to the licensee to collect information from external care providers, to use such information and to disclose the contents of the plan of care to external care providers and others.

**62. (9)** The licensee shall ensure that the following persons have approved the plan of care, including any revisions to it, and that a copy is provided to them:

1. The resident or the resident's substitute decision-maker.

2. The prescribed person if there is a person prescribed for the purpose of this paragraph.

3. A person with the requisite expertise in assessing the suitability of care services for the resident in light of those set out in the plan, if there is no person prescribed for the purpose of paragraph 2.

**47. (1)** Subject to subsection (4), as soon as possible and not later than two days after a resident commences residency in a retirement home, the licensee of a retirement home shall develop an initial plan of care for the resident based on the initial assessment of the resident's immediate care needs conducted under section 43 that includes all of the information listed in subsection 62 (4) of the Act that is relevant to the resident's immediate care needs.

**47. (2)** No later than 21 days after a resident commences residency in a retirement home, the licensee of the home shall develop a complete plan of care for the resident based on the full assessment of the resident's care needs and preferences conducted under section 44 that takes into account all of the matters that must be considered in a full assessment.

#### **Inspection Finding**

The plans of care that were reviewed do not set out the care services that are part of a package of care services that the resident is entitled to receive under the agreement with the licensee and whether or not the resident receives the service. The plans of care do not contain a statement indicating whether the resident has provided consent to the licensee to collect information from external care providers. There is no evidence that a copy is provided to the persons who have approved the plan of care. Further, the plans of care are not always being developed within the required time frame.

#### Outcome

The Licensee submitted plan to achieve compliance by March 3, 2017. RHRA to confirm compliance by inspection.

# 5. The Licensee failed to comply with O. Reg. 166/11, s. 20; Food preparation.

Specifically, the Licensee failed to comply with the following subsection(s):

**<u>20. (3)</u>** The licensee shall implement procedures for each of the following matters and ensure that all staff involved in preparing food receives adequate training in them and are retrained annually:

1. The safe handling and storage of food, including how to maintain food at an appropriate temperature and how to practice good hand hygiene.

2. The safe operation, cleaning and sanitizing of all dishes, utensils and equipment involved in food preparation.

3. The separation of clean and dirty dishes during the service of food.

- 4. The safe disposal of leftover food.
- 5. Appropriate cleaning schedules and sanitation practices.

**20. (4)** The licensee shall ensure that whenever food is prepared in the retirement home, at least one person involved in preparing the food holds a current certificate in food handling from the local public health unit or has recently successfully completed a food handling training program equivalent to that offered by public health units.

# **Inspection Finding**

The Licensee did not ensure that all staff involved in preparing food receives adequate training for each of the food preparation procedures and are retrained annually as per the legislative requirements. Further, the licensee did not ensure that whenever food is being prepared in the home, at least one person involved in preparing the food holds a current food handling certificate as per the legislative requirements.

#### Outcome

The Licensee submitted plan to achieve compliance by March 3, 2017. RHRA to confirm compliance by inspection.

# 6. The Licensee failed to comply with O. Reg. 166/11, s. 29; Administration of drugs or other substances.

Specifically, the Licensee failed to comply with the following subsection(s):

**<u>29.</u>** If one of the care services that the licensee or the staff of a retirement home provide to a resident of the home is the administration of a drug or other substance, the licensee shall ensure that,

(c) neither the licensee nor a staff member administers a drug to a resident in the home unless the licensee or the staff member has received training in the procedures applicable to the

(e) if the licensee or a staff member is involved in the administration of the drug or other substance at the home, that the licensee or staff member is trained in,

(i) ways of reducing the incidence of infectious disease, including maintaining proper hand hygiene,

(ii) the safe disposal of syringes and other sharps,



(iii) recognizing an adverse drug reaction and taking appropriate action; administration of the drug;

#### **Inspection Finding**

The licensee did not ensure that all staff who administers a drug to a resident receives training in the procedures applicable to the administration of the drug.

#### Outcome

The Licensee has advised it has taken corrective action to achieve compliance. RHRA to confirm compliance by inspection.

# 7. The Licensee failed to comply with O. Reg. 166/11, s. 30; Storage of drugs or other substances.

Specifically, the Licensee failed to comply with the following subsection(s):

<u>30.</u> If drugs or other substances are stored in a retirement home on behalf of a resident, the licensee of the home shall ensure that,

(c) an audit of the controlled substances mentioned in clause (b) is performed monthly.

#### **Inspection Finding**

The Licensee did not ensure that an audit of the controlled substances is performed monthly.

#### Outcome

The Licensee has advised it has taken corrective action to achieve compliance. RHRA to confirm compliance by inspection.



# NOTICE

The Final Inspection Report is being provided to the Licensee, the Registrar of the Retirement Homes Regulatory Authority (the "RHRA") and the home's Residents' Council, if any.

Section 55 of the RHA requires that the Final Inspection Report be posted in the home in a conspicuous and easily accessible location. In addition, the Licensee must ensure that copies of every Final Inspection Report from the previous two (2) years are made available in the Home, in an easily accessible location.
