#### **Purpose of Inspection**

The RHRA conducts routine inspections as set out in section 77(3) of the *Retirement Homes Act, 2010* (the "RHA").

## NON-COMPLIANCE

#### 1. The Licensee failed to comply with O. Reg. 166/11, s. 24; Emergency plan, general.

Specifically, the Licensee failed to comply with the following subsection(s):

#### 24. (5) The licensee shall,

(a) on an annual basis at least, test the emergency plan, including arrangements with community agencies, partner facilities and resources that will be involved in responding to an emergency, related to,

(ii) situations involving a missing resident,

#### **Inspection Finding**

The home had not annually tested their emergency plan related to situations involving a missing resident.

#### Outcome

The Licensee has advised it has taken corrective action to achieve compliance. RHRA to confirm compliance by inspection.

#### 2. The Licensee failed to comply with O. Reg. 166/11, s. 30; Storage of drugs or other substances.

Specifically, the Licensee failed to comply with the following subsection(s):

<u>30.</u> If drugs or other substances are stored in a retirement home on behalf of a resident, the licensee of the home shall ensure that,



(a) the drugs or other substances are stored in an area or a medication cart that,(i) is used exclusively for drugs or other substances and for supplies related to drugs or other substances,

## **Inspection Finding**

On the date of inspection the inspector noted that the area where medication was stored was not used exclusively for drugs.

#### Outcome

The Licensee took corrective action to achieve compliance.

The Final Inspection Report is being provided to the Licensee, the Registrar of the Retirement Homes Regulatory Authority (the "RHRA") and the home's Residents' Council, if any.
