Purpose of Inspection
The RHRA conducts routine inspections as set out in section 77(3) of the <i>Retirement Homes Act, 2010</i> (the "RHA").

NON-COMPLIANCE
<p>1. The Licensee failed to comply with the RHA, S.O. 2010, c. 11, s. 54; Contents.</p> <p>Specifically, the Licensee failed to comply with the following subsection(s):</p> <p>54. (2) The package of information shall include, at a minimum,</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (k) an itemized list of the different types of accommodation and care services provided in the retirement home and their prices; (s) information as to whether the retirement home has automatic sprinklers in each resident's room;
<p>Inspection Finding</p> <p>The home's information package did not meet the requirements.</p>
<p>Outcome</p> <p>The Licensee submitted plan to achieve compliance by November 30, 2017. RHRA to confirm compliance by inspection.</p>
<p>2. The Licensee failed to comply with the RHA, S.O. 2010, c. 11, s. 53; Agreement required.</p> <p>Specifically, the Licensee failed to comply with the following subsection(s):</p> <p>53. (1) The licensee of a retirement home shall enter into a written agreement with every resident of the home before the resident commences residency in the home.</p>

<p>Inspection Finding</p> <p>A resident did not sign a residency agreement prior to moving into the home as required.</p>
<p>Outcome</p> <p>Licensee has submitted a plan of corrective action. Compliance to be confirmed by inspection.</p>
<p>3. The Licensee failed to comply with O. Reg. 166/11, s. 24; Emergency plan, general. The Licensee failed to comply with O. Reg. 166/11, s. 25; Emergency plan, retirement home with more than 10 residents.</p> <p>Specifically, the Licensee failed to comply with the following subsection(s):</p> <p>24. (4) The licensee shall keep current all arrangements with community agencies, partner facilities and resources that will be involved in responding to an emergency.</p> <p>25. (2) The licensee shall ensure that the development of the emergency plan includes, (b) identification of hazards and risks that may give rise to an emergency affecting the home, whether the hazards and risks arise within the home or in the surrounding vicinity or community, and strategies to address those hazards and risks.</p> <p>25. (3) The licensee shall ensure that the emergency plan provides for the following: 3. Resources, supplies and equipment vital for the emergency response being set aside and readily available at the retirement home and regular testing of all such resources, supplies and equipment to ensure that they are in working order.</p>
<p>Inspection Finding</p> <p>The home's emergency plan did not meet the requirements.</p>
<p>Outcome</p> <p>Licensee has submitted a plan of corrective action. Compliance to be confirmed by inspection.</p>
<p>4. The Licensee failed to comply with the RHA, S.O. 2010, c. 11, s. 65; Training. The Licensee failed to comply with the RHA, S.O. 2010, c. 11, s. 65; On-going training. The Licensee failed to comply with the RHA, S.O. 2010, c. 11, s. 65; Additional training for direct care staff. The Licensee failed to comply with O. Reg. 166/11, s. 14; Staff training. The Licensee failed to comply with O. Reg. 166/11, s. 27; Infection prevention and control program.</p> <p>Specifically, the Licensee failed to comply with the following subsection(s):</p> <p>65. (2) Every licensee of a retirement home shall ensure that no staff work in the home unless they have received training in, (a) the Residents' Bill of Rights; (b) the licensee's policy mentioned in subsection 67 (4) to promote zero tolerance of abuse and neglect of residents; (c) the protection afforded for whistle-blowing described in section 115; (d) the licensee's policy mentioned in subsection 68 (3) regarding the use of personal assistance services devices for residents; (f) fire prevention and safety;</p>

65. (4) The licensee shall ensure that the persons who are required to receive the training described in subsection (2) receive on-going training as described in that subsection at the times required by the regulations.

65. (5) The licensee shall ensure that all staff who provide care services to residents receive training in the following matters and at the times required by the regulations, as a condition of continuing to have contact with residents, in addition to the other training that they are required to receive under this section:

3. Behaviour management.

14. (1) For the purposes of clause 65 (2) (j) of the Act, every licensee of a retirement home shall ensure that all staff who work in the home receive training in the procedure described in subsection 73 (1) of the Act for a person to complain to the licensee.

14. (2) For the purposes of subsection 65 (4) of the Act, the licensee shall ensure that the persons who are required to receive training under subsection 65 (2) of the Act receive the training at least annually.

27. (9) The licensee shall ensure that each staff member who works in the retirement home receives training on how to reduce the incidence of infectious disease transmission, including,

(a) the need for and method of maintaining proper hand hygiene and method of preventing cross contamination, including proper handling of soiled linens, the protection of uniforms, and the separation of clean and dirty items;

(b) the need for and process of reporting, providing surveillance of and documenting incidents of infectious illness.

Inspection Finding

Staff in the home was not all trained in the topics in which they required training.

Outcome

Licensee has submitted a plan of corrective action. Compliance to be confirmed by inspection.

5. The Licensee failed to comply with O. Reg. 166/11, s. 55; Contents of records.

Specifically, the Licensee failed to comply with the following subsection(s):

55. (1) The licensee of a retirement home shall keep a record for each resident of the home that complies with the requirements of this section.

55. (2) The record for each resident shall include,

(d) a copy of the resident’s most recent plan of care;

(e) a copy of the written agreement between the resident and the licensee required under section 53 of the Act;

55. (5) A licensee of a retirement home shall keep records proving compliance with the Act and this Regulation in relation to,

(c) the skills, qualifications and training of the staff who work in the home;

<p>Inspection Finding The home's records did not meet the requirements.</p>
<p>Outcome Licensee has submitted a plan of corrective action. Compliance to be confirmed by inspection.</p>
<p>6. The Licensee failed to comply with O. Reg. 166/11, s. 20; Food preparation.</p> <p>Specifically, the Licensee failed to comply with the following subsection(s):</p> <p>20. (4) The licensee shall ensure that whenever food is prepared in the retirement home, at least one person involved in preparing the food holds a current certificate in food handling from the local public health unit or has recently successfully completed a food handling training program equivalent to that offered by public health units.</p>
<p>Inspection Finding Staff in the home did not have certification in food handling when they required it.</p>
<p>Outcome Licensee has submitted a plan of corrective action. Compliance to be confirmed by inspection.</p>
<p>7. The Licensee failed to comply with O. Reg. 166/11, s. 29; Administration of drugs or other substances.</p> <p>Specifically, the Licensee failed to comply with the following subsection(s):</p> <p>29. If one of the care services that the licensee or the staff of a retirement home provide to a resident of the home is the administration of a drug or other substance, the licensee shall ensure that,</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (e) if the licensee or a staff member is involved in the administration of the drug or other substance at the home, that the licensee or staff member is trained in, <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) ways of reducing the incidence of infectious disease, including maintaining proper hand hygiene, (ii) the safe disposal of syringes and other sharps, (iii) recognizing an adverse drug reaction and taking appropriate action; (c) neither the licensee nor a staff member administers a drug to a resident in the home unless the licensee or the staff member has received training in the procedures applicable to the administration of the drug; (d) a member of a College, as defined in the Regulated Health Professions Act, 1991, supervises the administration of the drug or other substance to the resident in the home;
<p>Inspection Finding Staff administering medication to residents did not all have training in the topics related to medication administration as required. The home did not have a registered health professional to supervise the administration of drugs and other substances to residents in the home.</p>
<p>Outcome Licensee has submitted a plan of corrective action. Compliance to be confirmed by inspection.</p>
<p>8. The Licensee failed to comply with O. Reg. 166/11, s. 30; Storage of drugs or other substances.</p> <p>Specifically, the Licensee failed to comply with the following subsection(s):</p>

30. If drugs or other substances are stored in a retirement home on behalf of a resident, the licensee of the home shall ensure that,
 (a) the drugs or other substances are stored in an area or a medication cart that,
 (ii) is locked and secure

Inspection Finding

The home's medication storage did not meet the requirements.

Outcome

The Licensee submitted plan to achieve compliance by December 8, 2017. RHRA to confirm compliance by inspection.

9. The Licensee failed to comply with O. Reg. 166/11, s. 32; Records.

Specifically, the Licensee failed to comply with the following subsection(s):

32. If the licensee or a member of the staff of a retirement home administers a drug or other substance to a resident, the licensee shall ensure that,
 (b) if a drug is administered, there is written evidence that the drug was prescribed for the resident by a person who is authorized to prescribe a drug under section 27 of the Regulated Health Professions Act, 1991;

Inspection Finding

The home did not have evidence that all the drugs administered to residents in the home were prescribed for the residents by a person who was authorized to prescribe drugs as required.

Outcome

The Licensee has advised it has taken corrective action to achieve compliance. RHRA to confirm compliance by inspection.

NOTICE

The Final Inspection Report is being provided to the Licensee, the Registrar of the Retirement Homes Regulatory Authority (the "RHRA") and the home's Residents' Council, if any.

Section 55 of the RHA requires that the Final Inspection Report be posted in the home in a conspicuous and easily accessible location. In addition, the Licensee must ensure that copies of every Final Inspection Report from the previous two (2) years are made available in the Home, in an easily accessible location.
