Purpose of Inspection
The RHRA received a report under section 75(1) of the <i>Retirement Homes Act, 2010</i> (the "RHA").

NON-COMPLIANCE
<p>1. The Licensee failed to comply with the RHA, S.O. 2010, c. 11, s. 62; Contents of plan. The Licensee failed to comply with O. Reg. 166/11, s. 47; Development of plan of care.</p> <p>Specifically, the Licensee failed to comply with the following subsection(s):</p> <p>62. (4) The licensee of a retirement home shall ensure that there is a written plan of care for each resident of the home that sets out,</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (b) the planned care services for the resident that the licensee will provide, including, <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) the details of the services, (ii) the goals that the services are intended to achieve, (iii) clear directions to the licensee's staff who provide direct care to the resident; (a) the care services that are part of a package of care services that the resident is entitled to receive under the resident's agreement with the licensee, whether or not the resident receives the services; <p>47. (4) Subject to subsections (5) and (6), a plan of care for a resident is complete if the plan,</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (b) sets out, <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) any information that is necessary to allow the licensee's staff to understand the resident's needs and preferences, including cultural, spiritual and religious preferences and customary routines,
<p>Inspection Finding</p> <p>The plan of care was in place for the reviewed resident file; however, it was not specifically aligned with legislation. The plan of care didn't include all the care services that the resident was entitled to receive and did not provide clear direction to staff providing care and there was no evidence to support that the resident's preferences had been considered in developing the plan of care.</p>

Outcome


The Licensee must take corrective action to achieve compliance.

NOTICE

The Final Inspection Report is being provided to the Licensee, the Registrar of the Retirement Homes Regulatory Authority (the "RHRA") and the home's Residents' Council, if any.

Section 55 of the RHA requires that the Final Inspection Report be posted in the home in a conspicuous and easily accessible location. In addition, the Licensee must ensure that copies of every Final Inspection Report from the previous two (2) years are made available in the Home, in an easily accessible location.
