### **Purpose of Inspection**

The RHRA received a report under section 75(1) of the *Retirement Homes Act, 2010* (the "RHA").

## NON-COMPLIANCE

1. The Licensee failed to comply with the RHA, S.O. 2010, c. 11, s. 74; Licensee's duty to respond to incidents of wrongdoing.

Specifically, the Licensee failed to comply with the following subsection(s):

**<u>74.</u>** Every licensee of a retirement home shall ensure that,

(a) every alleged, suspected or witnessed incident of the following of which the licensee knows or that is reported to the licensee is immediately investigated:

(i) abuse of a resident of the home by anyone,

#### Inspection Finding

There is no evidence to show that the home responded to an issue of suspected financial abuse that began in August 2017 and completed an investigation in accordance with their zero tolerance of abuse policy, until April of 2018.

#### Outcome

The Licensee has advised it has taken corrective action to achieve compliance. RHRA to confirm compliance by inspection.

2. The Licensee failed to comply with the RHA, S.O. 2010, c. 11, s. 75; Reporting certain matters to Registrar.

Specifically, the Licensee failed to comply with the following subsection(s):

<u>75. (1)</u> A person who has reasonable grounds to suspect that any of the following has occurred or may occur shall immediately report the suspicion and the information upon which it is based to the Registrar:
4. Misuse or misappropriation of a resident's money.

### Inspection Finding

The home did not report immediately to the Registrar an issue of suspected misuse or misappropriation of a resident's money.

#### Outcome

The Licensee has advised it has taken corrective action to achieve compliance. RHRA to confirm compliance by inspection.

The Final Inspection Report is being provided to the Licensee, the Registrar of the Retirement Homes Regulatory Authority (the "RHRA") and the home's Residents' Council, if any.
