Purpose of Inspection
The RHRA conducts routine inspections as set out in section 77(3) of the <i>Retirement Homes Act, 2010</i> (the "RHA").

NON-COMPLIANCE
<p>1. The Licensee failed to comply with O. Reg. 166/11, s. 24; Emergency plan, general. The Licensee failed to comply with O. Reg. 166/11, s. 25; Emergency plan, retirement home with more than 10 residents.</p> <p>Specifically, the Licensee failed to comply with the following subsection(s):</p> <p>24. (5) The licensee shall,</p> <p style="padding-left: 40px;">(a) on an annual basis at least, test the emergency plan, including arrangements with community agencies, partner facilities and resources that will be involved in responding to an emergency, related to,</p> <p style="padding-left: 80px;">(iii) medical emergencies,</p> <p>25. (3) The licensee shall ensure that the emergency plan provides for the following:</p> <p style="padding-left: 40px;">3. Resources, supplies and equipment vital for the emergency response being set aside and readily available at the retirement home and regular testing of all such resources, supplies and equipment to ensure that they are in working order.</p> <p>25. (5) The licensee shall ensure that the emergency plan for the retirement home is evaluated and updated at least annually and that the updating includes contact information for the relevant community agencies, partner facilities and resources that will be involved in responding to an emergency.</p>
<p>Inspection Finding</p> <p>There was no evidence that the required testing was completed for the areas cited. Also, the emergency plan was not evaluated and updated annually.</p>

Outcome

Licensee has advised it has taken corrective action to achieve compliance. RHRA to confirm compliance by inspection.

2. The Licensee failed to comply with the RHA, S.O. 2010, c. 11, s. 65; Training.

Specifically, the Licensee failed to comply with the following subsection(s):

65. (2) Every licensee of a retirement home shall ensure that no staff work in the home unless they have received training in,

(b) the licensee's policy mentioned in subsection 67 (4) to promote zero tolerance of abuse and neglect of residents;

(d) the licensee's policy mentioned in subsection 68 (3) regarding the use of personal assistance services devices for residents;

Inspection Finding

A staff member did not receive the required training on policies prior to working in the home.

Outcome


Licensee has advised it has taken corrective action to achieve compliance. RHRA to confirm compliance by inspection.

The Final Inspection Report is being provided to the Licensee, the Registrar of the Retirement Homes Regulatory Authority (the "RHRA") and the home's Residents' Council, if any.
