Purpose of Inspection

The RHRA received a report under section 75(1) of the Retirement Homes Act, 2010 (the "RHA").

NON-COMPLIANCE

1. The Licensee failed to comply with O. Reg. 166/11, s. 29; Administration of drugs or other substances.

Specifically, the Licensee failed to comply with the following subsection(s):

- <u>29.</u> If one of the care services that the licensee or the staff of a retirement home provide to a resident of the home is the administration of a drug or other substance, the licensee shall ensure that,
 - (b) no drug is administered by the licensee or the staff to the resident in the home except in accordance with the directions for use specified by the person who prescribed the drug for the resident;

Inspection Finding

Records reviewed indicated that a resident who was receiving drug administration, did not have his medication administered as prescribed.

Outcome

The Licensee submitted plan to achieve compliance by October 30, 2018. RHRA to confirm compliance by inspection.

2. The Licensee failed to comply with the RHA, S.O. 2010, c. 11, s. 64; Hiring staff.

The Licensee failed to comply with the RHA, S.O. 2010, c. 11, s. 64; Police background checks.

The Licensee failed to comply with O. Reg. 166/11, s. 13; Hiring staff and volunteers.

Specifically, the Licensee failed to comply with the following subsection(s):

- **64. (1)** A licensee of a retirement home shall ensure that screening measures are conducted in accordance with the regulations before hiring staff and accepting volunteers to work in the home.
- <u>64. (2)</u> The screening measures shall include a police background check as defined in the regulations, unless the person being screened is under 18 years of age.
- **13. (1)** The police background check required by section 64 of the Act for a staff member or a volunteer working in a retirement home shall be,
 - (a) conducted by a police force;
 - (b) conducted within six months before the licensee of the home hires the staff member or accepts the volunteer to work in the home, as the case may be.
- **13. (2)** The police background check shall include a vulnerable sector screen to determine the person's suitability to be a staff member or volunteer in a retirement home and to protect residents from abuse and neglect.

Inspection Finding

At the time of the inspection, the Licensee failed to provide proof that a police background check, including a vulnerable sector screen had been conducted for at least one employee.

Outcome

The Licensee advised it has taken corrective action to achieve compliance. RHRA to confirm compliance by inspection.
