Purpose of Inspection
The RHRA conducts routine inspections as set out in section 77(3) of the <i>Retirement Homes Act, 2010</i> (the "RHA").

NON-COMPLIANCE
<p><b>1. The Licensee failed to comply with the RHA, S.O. 2010, c. 11, s. 55; Posting information.</b></p> <p>Specifically, the Licensee failed to comply with the following subsection(s):</p> <p><b>55. (2)</b> Every licensee of a retirement home shall ensure that the following information is posted in the home in a conspicuous and easily accessible location and in a manner that complies with the prescribed requirements, if any:</p> <p>1. The Residents' Bill of Rights.</p>
<p><b>Inspection Finding</b></p> <p>The Licensee had not posted the Resident's Bill of Rights in the home, despite being provided with a current Bill of Rights following the previous inspection.</p>
<p><b>Outcome</b></p> <p>The Licensee has demonstrated it has taken corrective action to achieve compliance. RHRA to confirm compliance by inspection.</p>
<p><b>2. The Licensee failed to comply with O. Reg. 166/11, s. 22; Risk of falls.</b></p> <p>Specifically, the Licensee failed to comply with the following subsection(s):</p> <p><b>22. (1)</b> Every licensee of a retirement home shall develop, document and implement strategies to reduce or mitigate the risk of falls in common areas of the home.</p>

**22. (3)** If a resident of a retirement home falls in the home in circumstances other than those described in subsection (2) and the licensee or a staff member becomes aware of the fall, the licensee shall ensure that the licensee or a staff member documents the fall, the response to the fall and the corrective actions taken, if any.

**22. (4)** Every licensee of a retirement home shall keep a written record of all falls for which the licensee is required to ensure documentation under subsection (2) or (3) and that occur in each year, evaluate the risk of falls in the home at least annually and keep a written record of each evaluation.

**Inspection Finding**

The Licensee had not fully implemented their falls strategy, and had failed to document several falls appropriately - including the home's response to the fall and the corrective actions taken. Furthermore, there was no evidence of an annual evaluation of the risk of falls in the home.

**Outcome**


The Licensee has advised it has taken corrective action to achieve compliance. RHRA to confirm compliance by inspection.

**NOTICE**

The Final Inspection Report is being provided to the Licensee, the Registrar of the Retirement Homes Regulatory Authority (the "RHRA") and the home's Residents' Council, if any.

Section 55 of the RHA requires that the Final Inspection Report be posted in the home in a conspicuous and easily accessible location. In addition, the Licensee must ensure that copies of every Final Inspection Report from the previous two (2) years are made available in the Home, in an easily accessible location.
