Purpose of Inspection
The RHRA conducts routine inspections as set out in section 77(3) of the <i>Retirement Homes Act, 2010</i> (the "RHA").

NON-COMPLIANCE
<p>1. The Licensee failed to comply with the RHA, S.O. 2010, c. 11, s. 54; Contents.</p> <p>Specifically, the Licensee failed to comply with the following subsection(s):</p> <p>54. (2) The package of information shall include, at a minimum, (k) an itemized list of the different types of accommodation and care services provided in the retirement home and their prices;</p>
<p>Inspection Finding The home's information package did not meet the requirements.</p>
<p>Outcome The Licensee submitted a plan to achieve compliance by December 31, 2018. RHRA to confirm compliance by inspection.</p>
<p>2. The Licensee failed to comply with the RHA, S.O. 2010, c. 11, s. 53; Agreement required.</p> <p>Specifically, the Licensee failed to comply with the following subsection(s):</p> <p>53. (1) The licensee of a retirement home shall enter into a written agreement with every resident of the home before the resident commences residency in the home.</p>
<p>Inspection Finding Three residents had not entered into a written agreement prior to commencing residency in the home as required.</p>
<p>Outcome The Licensee has advised it has taken corrective action to achieve compliance. RHRA to confirm compliance by inspectio</p>

- 3. The Licensee failed to comply with the RHA, S.O. 2010, c. 11, s. 60; Safety plans.
The Licensee failed to comply with O. Reg. 166/11, s. 24; Emergency plan, general.
The Licensee failed to comply with O. Reg. 166/11, s. 25; Emergency plan, retirement home with more than 10 residents.**

Specifically, the Licensee failed to comply with the following subsection(s):

- 60. (4)** Every licensee of a retirement home shall ensure that the following are in place for the home:
1. An emergency plan that responds to emergencies in the home or in the community in which the home is located and that meets the prescribed requirements.
- 24. (4)** The licensee shall keep current all arrangements with community agencies, partner facilities and resources that will be involved in responding to an emergency.
- 25. (2)** The licensee shall ensure that the development of the emergency plan includes,
- (a) consultation with the relevant community agencies, partner facilities and resources that will be involved in responding to an emergency;
 - (b) identification of hazards and risks that may give rise to an emergency affecting the home, whether the hazards and risks arise within the home or in the surrounding vicinity or community, and strategies to address those hazards and risks.
- 25. (3)** The licensee shall ensure that the emergency plan provides for the following:
1. Dealing with,
 - ii. community disasters,
 - iii. violent outbursts,
 - iv. bomb threats,
 - v. medical emergencies,
 - vi. chemical spills,
 - vii. situations involving a missing resident,
 - viii. loss of one or more essential services.
 2. Evacuation of the retirement home, including a system in the home to account for the whereabouts of all residents in the event that it is necessary to evacuate and relocate residents and evacuate staff and others in case of an emergency.
 3. Resources, supplies and equipment vital for the emergency response being set aside and readily available at the retirement home and regular testing of all such resources, supplies and equipment to ensure that they are in working order.
 4. Identification of the community agencies, partner facilities and resources that will be involved in responding to an emergency.
- 25. (4)** The licensee shall ensure that the emergency plan addresses the following components:
1. Plan activation.
 2. Lines of authority.
 3. Communications plan.
 4. Specific staff roles and responsibilities.

25. (5) The licensee shall ensure that the emergency plan for the retirement home is evaluated and updated at least annually and that the updating includes contact information for the relevant community agencies, partner facilities and resources that will be involved in responding to an emergency.

Inspection Finding

The home did not have an emergency plan that met the requirements.

Outcome

The Licensee submitted a plan to achieve compliance by December 31, 2018. RHRA to confirm compliance by inspection.

4. The Licensee failed to comply with O. Reg. 166/11, s. 27; Infection prevention and control program.

Specifically, the Licensee failed to comply with the following subsection(s):

27. (2) The licensee shall consult on an ongoing basis and not less than once a year with the local medical officer of health or designate about identifying and addressing health care issues in the retirement home in order to reduce the incidence of infectious disease outbreaks in the home.

27. (3) The licensee shall keep a written record of the consultation required under subsection (2) that shall include a record of when the consultation took place, what was discussed and any recommendations that the local medical officer of health or designate made.

Inspection Finding

The home's infection prevention and control program did not meet the requirements.

Outcome

The Licensee submitted a plan to achieve compliance by December 31, 2018. RHRA to confirm compliance by inspection.

**5. The Licensee failed to comply with O. Reg. 166/11, s. 43; Initial assessment of care needs.
The Licensee failed to comply with O. Reg. 166/11, s. 44; Full assessment of care needs.**

Specifically, the Licensee failed to comply with the following subsection(s):

43. (2) The initial assessment mentioned in subsection (1) shall consider the following matters with respect to the resident:

- 2. Presence of infectious diseases.

44. (1) Subject to section 46, no later than 14 days after a resident commences residency in a retirement home, the licensee shall ensure that a full assessment of the resident's care needs and preferences is conducted.

44. (2) The full assessment mentioned in subsection (1) shall consider the following matters with respect to the resident:

- 7. The matters listed in subsection 43 (2).

Inspection Finding

The home's assessments did not meet the requirements.

Outcome

The Licensee submitted a plan to achieve compliance by December 31, 2018. RHRA to confirm compliance by inspection.

- 6. The Licensee failed to comply with the RHA, S.O. 2010, c. 11, s. 65; Training.**
The Licensee failed to comply with O. Reg. 166/11, s. 14; Staff training.
The Licensee failed to comply with O. Reg. 166/11, s. 27; Infection prevention and control program.

Specifically, the Licensee failed to comply with the following subsection(s):

65. (2) Every licensee of a retirement home shall ensure that no staff work in the home unless they have received training in,

- (a) the Residents’ Bill of Rights;
- (b) the licensee’s policy mentioned in subsection 67 (4) to promote zero tolerance of abuse and neglect of residents;
- (c) the protection afforded for whistle-blowing described in section 115;
- (d) the licensee’s policy mentioned in subsection 68 (3) regarding the use of personal assistance services devices for residents;
- (f) fire prevention and safety;

14. (1) For the purposes of clause 65 (2) (j) of the Act, every licensee of a retirement home shall ensure that all staff who work in the home receive training in the procedure described in subsection 73 (1) of the Act for a person to complain to the licensee.

27. (9) The licensee shall ensure that each staff member who works in the retirement home receives training on how to reduce the incidence of infectious disease transmission, including,

- (a) the need for and method of maintaining proper hand hygiene and method of preventing cross contamination, including proper handling of soiled linens, the protection of uniforms, and the separation of clean and dirty items;
- (b) the need for and process of reporting, providing surveillance of and documenting incidents of infectious illness.

Inspection Finding

Staff was not all trained in all the topics in which they required training.

Outcome

The Licensee submitted a plan to achieve compliance by December 31, 2018. RHRA to confirm compliance by inspection.

- 7. The Licensee failed to comply with the RHA, S.O. 2010, c. 11, s. 67; Contents.**

Specifically, the Licensee failed to comply with the following subsection(s):

67. (5) At a minimum, the policy to promote zero tolerance of abuse and neglect of residents shall,

- (a) clearly set out what constitutes abuse and neglect;

Inspection Finding

The home's abuse policy did not meet the requirements.

<p>Outcome</p> <p>The Licensee submitted a plan to achieve compliance by December 31, 2018. RHRA to confirm compliance by inspection.</p>
<p>8. The Licensee failed to comply with O. Reg. 166/11, s. 20; Food preparation.</p> <p>Specifically, the Licensee failed to comply with the following subsection(s):</p> <p>20. (4) The licensee shall ensure that whenever food is prepared in the retirement home, at least one person involved in preparing the food holds a current certificate in food handling from the local public health unit or has recently successfully completed a food handling training program equivalent to that offered by public health units.</p>
<p>Inspection Finding</p> <p>Two of the staff did not have training in food handling as required.</p>
<p>Outcome</p> <p>The Licensee has advised it has taken corrective action to achieve compliance. RHRA to confirm compliance by inspection.</p>
<p>9. The Licensee failed to comply with O. Reg. 166/11, s. 23; Behaviour management.</p> <p>Specifically, the Licensee failed to comply with the following subsection(s):</p> <p>23. (1) Every licensee of a retirement home shall develop and implement a written behaviour management strategy that includes,</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (a) techniques to prevent and address resident behaviours that pose a risk to the resident or others in the home; (b) strategies for interventions to prevent and address resident behaviours that pose a risk to the resident or others in the home; (c) strategies for monitoring residents that have demonstrated behaviours that pose a risk to the resident or others in the home; (d) protocols for how staff and volunteers shall report and be informed of resident behaviours that pose a risk to the resident or others in the home.
<p>Inspection Finding</p> <p>The home did not have a behaviour management strategy as required.</p>
<p>Outcome</p> <p>The Licensee submitted a plan to achieve compliance by December 31, 2018. RHRA to confirm compliance by inspection.</p>
<p>10. The Licensee failed to comply with O. Reg. 166/11, s. 29; Administration of drugs or other substances.</p> <p>Specifically, the Licensee failed to comply with the following subsection(s):</p> <p>29. If one of the care services that the licensee or the staff of a retirement home provide to a resident of the home is the administration of a drug or other substance, the licensee shall ensure that,</p>

- (c) neither the licensee nor a staff member administers a drug to a resident in the home unless the licensee or the staff member has received training in the procedures applicable to the administration of the drug;
- (e) if the licensee or a staff member is involved in the administration of the drug or other substance at the home, that the licensee or staff member is trained in,
 - (i) ways of reducing the incidence of infectious disease, including maintaining proper hand hygiene,
 - (ii) the safe disposal of syringes and other sharps,
 - (iii) recognizing an adverse drug reaction and taking appropriate action;

Inspection Finding

Staff was not trained on the topics in which they required training related to to the administration of medication.

Outcome

The Licensee submitted a plan to achieve compliance by December 31, 2018. RHRA to confirm compliance by inspection.

11. The Licensee failed to comply with O. Reg. 166/11, s. 31; Medication management system.

Specifically, the Licensee failed to comply with the following subsection(s):

31. (1) If one of the care services that the licensee or the staff of a retirement home provide to a resident of the home is the administration of a drug or other substance, the licensee shall establish a medication management system, which includes written policies and procedures, to ensure that all drugs and other substances to be administered to residents of the home are acquired, received in the home, stored, dispensed, administered, destroyed and disposed of correctly as required by law and in accordance with prevailing practices.

Inspection Finding

The home's medication management system did not meet the requirements.

Outcome

The Licensee submitted a plan to achieve compliance by December 31, 2018. RHRA to confirm compliance by inspection.

12. The Licensee failed to comply with O. Reg. 166/11, s. 32; Records.

Specifically, the Licensee failed to comply with the following subsection(s):

32. If the licensee or a member of the staff of a retirement home administers a drug or other substance to a resident, the licensee shall ensure that,

- (b) if a drug is administered, there is written evidence that the drug was prescribed for the resident by a person who is authorized to prescribe a drug under section 27 of the Regulated Health Professions Act, 1991;

Inspection Finding

The home did not have written evidence that all of the drugs that were administered to residents were prescribed for the residents by a person who was authorized to prescribe drugs as required.

Outcome

The Licensee submitted a plan to achieve compliance by December 31, 2018. RHRA to confirm compliance by inspection.

13. The Licensee failed to comply with O. Reg. 166/11, s. 55; Contents of records.

Specifically, the Licensee failed to comply with the following subsection(s):

55. (1) The licensee of a retirement home shall keep a record for each resident of the home that complies with the requirements of this section.

55. (2) The record for each resident shall include,

(d) a copy of the resident's most recent plan of care;

(e) a copy of the written agreement between the resident and the licensee required under section 53 of the Act;

55. (3) In addition to subsection (2), for each resident of a retirement home to which the licensee of the home provides at least one care service, the record shall include,

(a) the following documents or information to the extent that they are reasonably available to the licensee:

(i) the name and contact information of the resident's known substitute decision-makers, if any,

55. (5) A licensee of a retirement home shall keep records proving compliance with the Act and this Regulation in relation to,

(c) the skills, qualifications and training of the staff who work in the home;

Inspection Finding

The home's records did not meet the requirements.

Outcome


The Licensee submitted a plan to achieve compliance by December 31, 2018. RHRA to confirm compliance by inspection.

NOTICE

The Final Inspection Report is being provided to the Licensee, the Registrar of the Retirement Homes Regulatory Authority (the "RHRA") and the home's Residents' Council, if any.

Section 55 of the RHA requires that the Final Inspection Report be posted in the home in a conspicuous and easily accessible location. In addition, the Licensee must ensure that copies of every Final Inspection Report from the previous two (2) years are made available in the Home, in an easily accessible location.
