Purpose of Inspection
The RHRA received a report under section 75(1) of the <i>Retirement Homes Act, 2010</i> (the "RHA").

NON-COMPLIANCE
<p>1. The Licensee failed to comply with the RHA, S.O. 2010, c. 11, s. 62; Plan of care. The Licensee failed to comply with the RHA, S.O. 2010, c. 11, s. 62; Reassessment and revision.</p> <p>Specifically, the Licensee failed to comply with the following subsection(s):</p> <p>62. (1) When a resident commences his or her residency in a retirement home, the licensee shall, within the prescribed times, ensure that the resident is assessed and that a plan of care is developed based on the assessment and in accordance with this section and the regulations.</p> <p>62. (12) The licensee shall ensure that the resident is reassessed and the plan of care reviewed and revised at least every six months and at any other time if, in the opinion of the licensee or the resident,</p> <p>(b) the resident's care needs change or the care services set out in the plan are no longer necessary;</p>
<p>Inspection Finding</p> <p>Evidence collected at the time of the inspection shows that the plan of care was not completed for one resident and not revised for another resident whose care needs changed.</p>
<p>Outcome</p> <p>The Licensee has demonstrated it has taken corrective action to achieve compliance. RHRA to confirm compliance by inspection.</p>
<p>2. The Licensee failed to comply with O. Reg. 166/11, s. 36; Contenance care.</p> <p>Specifically, the Licensee failed to comply with the following subsection(s):</p>

36. (1) If one of the care services that the licensee or the staff of a retirement home provide to a resident of the home is continence care, the licensee shall establish a continence care program that includes,

- (a) measures to promote continence;
- (c) toileting programs;

Inspection Finding

There is a lack of evidence to support that the home established a continence care program for one resident that includes toileting programs and measures to promote continence.

Outcome


The Licensee has demonstrated it has taken corrective action to achieve compliance. RHRA to confirm compliance by inspection.

The Final Inspection Report is being provided to the Licensee, the Registrar of the Retirement Homes Regulatory Authority (the "RHRA") and the home's Residents' Council, if any.
