## **Purpose of Inspection**

The RHRA received a report under section 75(1) of the Retirement Homes Act, 2010 (the "RHA").

## **NON-COMPLIANCE**

1. The Licensee failed to comply with the RHA, S.O. 2010, c. 11, s. 62; Contents of plan.

Specifically, the Licensee failed to comply with the following subsection(s):

- <u>62. (4)</u> The licensee of a retirement home shall ensure that there is a written plan of care for each resident of the home that sets out,
  - (b) the planned care services for the resident that the licensee will provide, including,
    - (i) the details of the services,
    - (iii) clear directions to the licensee's staff who provide direct care to the resident;

#### **Inspection Finding**

The Licensee did not ensure that a resident's plan of care includes details and clear directions to staff related to the resident's assistance with mobility and continence care.

#### **Outcome**

The Licensee must take corrective action to achieve compliance.

2. The Licensee failed to comply with the RHA, S.O. 2010, c. 11, s. 61; No interference.

Specifically, the Licensee failed to comply with the following subsection(s):

<u>61. (2)</u> Subject to sections 67 and 68, a licensee of a retirement home shall not interfere with the provision of care services to a resident of the home by an external care provider.

## **Inspection Finding**

The manager of the home interfered with the provision of care services by an external care provider in speaking to an agency PSW in a manner which caused her to fear for her safety and leave the home before she could complete care to the residents.

## **Outcome**

The Licensee must take corrective action to achieve compliance.
