Purpose of Inspection
The RHRA conducts compliance inspections as set out in section 77(1) of the <i>Retirement Homes Act, 2010</i> (the "RHA").

<p>Inspection Finding</p> <p>The home was unable to demonstrate that they were completing and documenting adequate and sufficient cleaning procedures within the home.</p>
<p>Outcome</p> <p>The Licensee has advised it has taken corrective action to achieve compliance. RHRA to confirm compliance by inspection.</p>

Reg. 166/11, s. 27; Infection prevention and control program.</p> <p>Specifically, the Licensee failed to comply with the following subsection(s):</p> <p>27. (5) The licensee of a retirement home shall ensure that,</p> <p>(0.b) all reasonable steps are taken in the retirement home to follow,</p> <p>(i) any directive respecting coronavirus (COVID-19) issued to long-term care homes by the Chief Medical Officer of Health under section 77.7 of the Health Protection and Promotion Act,</p>

(ii) any guidance, advice or recommendations respecting coronavirus (COVID-19) that are given to long-term care homes by the Chief Medical Officer of Health and made available on the Government of Ontario's website respecting coronavirus (COVID-19);

Inspection Finding

The Licensee failed to take all reasonable steps to follow the recommendations, guidance and advice and directives of the Chief Medical Officer of Health regarding COVID-19. Specifically, the following were a concern: staff and visitors are not properly or adequately screened, and residents were not adhering to physical distancing guidelines in the dining room and common areas.

Outcome


The Licensee has advised it has taken corrective action to achieve compliance. RHRA to confirm compliance by inspection.

The Final Inspection Report is being provided to the Licensee, the Registrar of the Retirement Homes Regulatory Authority (the "RHRA") and the home's Residents' Council, if any.
