

# FINAL INSPECTION REPORT Under the Retirement Homes Act, 2010

# **Purpose of Inspection**

The RHRA received a report under section 75(1) of the Retirement Homes Act, 2010 (the "RHA").

## **NON-COMPLIANCE**

1. The Licensee failed to comply with an order made under s. 90 RHA, S.O. 2010.

# **Inspection Finding**

Inspection revealed that the Licensee is in contravention of compliance order No. 2019-T0242-90-01 dated June 14, 2019 and revocation order No 2020-T0242-95-01 issued January 20, 2020.

## **Outcome**

The License was revoked as of June 9, 2020.

2. The Licensee failed to comply with O. Reg. 166/11, s. 29; Administration of drugs or other substances.

The Licensee failed to comply with O. Reg. 166/11, s. 32; Records.

Specifically, the Licensee failed to comply with the following subsection(s):

- <u>29.</u> If one of the care services that the licensee or the staff of a retirement home provide to a resident of the home is the administration of a drug or other substance, the licensee shall ensure that,
  - (b) no drug is administered by the licensee or the staff to the resident in the home except in accordance with the directions for use specified by the person who prescribed the drug for the resident;
- <u>32.</u> If the licensee or a member of the staff of a retirement home administers a drug or other substance to a resident, the licensee shall ensure that,

(a) the person who administered the drug or other substance prepares a written record noting the name and amount of the drug or other substance, the route of its administration and the time and date on which it was administered;

# **Inspection Finding**

Evidence shows that staff are not always ensuring drugs are administered in accordance with the directions for use. Further, staff are not always preparing a written record of administration of a drug

#### Outcome

The License was revoked as of June 9, 2020.

3. The Licensee failed to comply with O. Reg. 166/11, s. 23; Behaviour management.

Specifically, the Licensee failed to comply with the following subsection(s):

- **23. (1)** Every licensee of a retirement home shall develop and implement a written behaviour management strategy that includes,
  - (a) techniques to prevent and address resident behaviours that pose a risk to the resident or others in the home;
  - (b) strategies for interventions to prevent and address resident behaviours that pose a risk to the resident or others in the home;
  - (c) strategies for monitoring residents that have demonstrated behaviours that pose a risk to the resident or others in the home;

# **Inspection Finding**

The Licensee failed to implement their behavior management strategies as there was no evidence of monitoring and no strategies in place to address two resident's behaviors that pose a risk of harm to the resident.

#### Outcome

The Licence was revoked as of June 9, 2020.

4. The Licensee failed to comply with the RHA, S.O. 2010, c. 11, s. 62; Reassessment and revision.

Specifically, the Licensee failed to comply with the following subsection(s):

- **62. (12)** The licensee shall ensure that the resident is reassessed and the plan of care reviewed and revised at least every six months and at any other time if, in the opinion of the licensee or the resident,
  - (b) the resident's care needs change or the care services set out in the plan are no longer necessary;

# **Inspection Finding**

Evidence shows that a residents care needs changed and his plan of care was not revised to reflect the changes.
