

FINAL INSPECTION REPORT Under the *Retirement Homes Act, 2010*

Purpose of Inspection

The RHRA received a report under section 75(1) of the Retirement Homes Act, 2010 (the "RHA").

NON-COMPLIANCE

1. The Licensee failed to comply with the RHA, S.O. 2010, c. 11, s. 67; Same, neglect.

Specifically, the Licensee failed to comply with the following subsection(s):

<u>67. (2)</u> Every licensee of a retirement home shall ensure that the licensee and the staff of the home do not neglect the residents.

Inspection Finding

An inspection was conducted December 9, 2020, at the home in relation to the COVID-19 outbreak which began October 27, 2020; after reports were made to the RHRA from community partners regarding conditions in the home. The home was not able to demonstrate that they were providing all required care services to residents that were outlined in the residents plans of care in accordance to Act 62 (10). Additionally, the home was not able to demonstrate that they had updated resident plans of care as their condition declined, in order to ensure the necessary care was being provided in accordance to Act 62(12)(b). The inspection revealed that the home's inaction led to the neglect of residents in the home.

Outcome

The Licensee has advised it has taken corrective action to achieve compliance. RHRA to confirm compliance by inspection.

2. The Licensee failed to comply with O. Reg. 166/11, s. 17; Cleanliness.

Specifically, the Licensee failed to comply with the following subsection(s):

<u>17. (1)</u> Every licensee of a retirement home shall ensure that the common areas of the home, including the floors and any furnishings, equipment and linens in those areas, are clean and sanitary.

<u>**17. (3)**</u> The licensee shall document the routines and methods used to comply with subsections (1) and (2).

Inspection Finding

The home was not able to demonstrate they were completing appropriate cleaning of high touch surfaces of the home, nor were they keeping accurate records of the routines and methods used with their cleaning methods.

Outcome

The Licensee has advised it has taken corrective action to achieve compliance. RHRA to confirm compliance by inspection.

3. The Licensee failed to comply with O. Reg. 166/11, s. 27; Infection prevention and control program.

Specifically, the Licensee failed to comply with the following subsection(s):

27. (5) The licensee of a retirement home shall ensure that,

(0.b) all reasonable steps are taken in the retirement home to follow,

(i) any directive respecting coronavirus (COVID-19) issued to long-term care homes by the Chief Medical Officer of Health under section 77.7 of the Health Protection and Promotion Act,

(ii) any guidance, advice or recommendations respecting coronavirus (COVID-19) that are given to long-term care homes by the Chief Medical Officer of Health and made available on the Government of Ontario's website respecting coronavirus (COVID-19);

(0.a) any guidance, advice or recommendations given to retirement homes by the Chief Medical Officer of Health are followed in the retirement home;

Inspection Finding

The home was not able to demonstrate they were following the recommendations given by the Chief Medical Office of Health (CMOH), nor were they following the directives from the CMOH respecting COVID-19 in the following areas: 1. The home was not conducting proper screening of staff or visitors. 2. Staff were not using PPE appropriately. 3. Staff were visiting onsite outside of work hours

Outcome

The Licensee has advised it has taken corrective action to achieve compliance. RHRA to confirm compliance by inspection.



NOTICE

The Final Inspection Report is being provided to the Licensee, the Registrar of the Retirement Homes Regulatory Authority (the "RHRA") and the home's Residents' Council, if any.

Section 55 of the RHA requires that the Final Inspection Report be posted in the home in a conspicuous and easily accessible location.
