Purpose of Inspection

The RHRA conducts compliance inspections as set out in section 77(1) of the *Retirement Homes Act, 2010* (the "RHA").

NON-COMPLIANCE

The Licensee failed to comply with the RHA, S.O. 2010, c. 11, s. 65; Training.
The Licensee failed to comply with O. Reg. 166/11, s. 27; Infection prevention and control program.

Specifically, the Licensee failed to comply with the following subsection(s):

- **65. (2)** Every licensee of a retirement home shall ensure that no staff work in the home unless they have received training in,
 - (h) the emergency plan and the infection prevention and control program of the licensee for the home mentioned in subsection 60 (4);
- **27. (9)** The licensee shall ensure that each staff member who works in the retirement home receives training on how to reduce the incidence of infectious disease transmission, including,
 - (a) the need for and method of maintaining proper hand hygiene and method of preventing cross contamination, including proper handling of soiled linens, the protection of uniforms, and the separation of clean and dirty items;

Inspection Finding

The home failed to ensure staff are trained on how to reduce the incidence of infectious disease transmission as outlined above.

Outcome

The Licensee submitted a plan to achieve compliance by March 12, 2021. RHRA to confirm compliance by inspection.

2. The Licensee failed to comply with O. Reg. 166/11, s. 27; Infection prevention and control program.

Specifically, the Licensee failed to comply with the following subsection(s):

27. (7) The licensee of a retirement home shall ensure that waterless, alcohol-based hand sanitizer or another form of hand sanitation that provides equivalent protection against infectious disease transmission is available for use by residents and staff in communal resident areas and in staff work areas

Inspection Finding

The home failed to provide an adequate supply of ABHR located in the three resident room wings.

Outcome

The Licensee has demonstrated it has taken corrective action to achieve compliance.

3. The Licensee failed to comply with O. Reg. 166/11, s. 17; Cleanliness.

Specifically, the Licensee failed to comply with the following subsection(s):

17. (3) The licensee shall document the routines and methods used to comply with subsections (1) and (2).

Inspection Finding

The home was not able to demonstrate they are keeping accurate records of the routines and methods used with their cleaning methods for resident rooms.

Outcome

The Licensee submitted a plan to achieve compliance by March 6, 2021. RHRA to confirm compliance by inspection.

4. The Licensee failed to comply with O. Reg. 166/11, s. 27; Infection prevention and control program.

Specifically, the Licensee failed to comply with the following subsection(s):

- 27. (5) The licensee of a retirement home shall ensure that,
 - (0.b) all reasonable steps are taken in the retirement home to follow,
 - (i) any directive respecting coronavirus (COVID-19) issued to long-term care homes by the Chief Medical Officer of Health under section 77.7 of the Health Protection and Promotion Act,
 - (ii) any guidance, advice or recommendations respecting coronavirus (COVID-19) that are given to long-term care homes by the Chief Medical Officer of Health and made available on the Government of Ontario's website respecting coronavirus (COVID-19);
 - (0.a) any guidance, advice or recommendations given to retirement homes by the Chief Medical Officer of Health are followed in the retirement home;

Inspection Finding

The home was not able to demonstrate they were following the guidance, advice and recommendations given by the Chief Medical Office of Health (CMOH), nor were they following the directives from the CMOH respecting the Coronavirus in the following areas: 1. The home was not conducting active screening of symptoms with visitors 2. The home did not document active screening of symptoms with residents 3. The home had available unapproved surgical masks. 4. The home did not demonstrate a PPE inventory. 5. The home failed to demonstrate cleaning and disinfecting of high touch surface areas at least twice daily. 6. The home failed to demonstrate staff are trained how to don and doff PPE. 7. The home failed to follow the visitor policy with respect to offering residents an option for Essential Care Providers. 8. The home failed to demonstrate a written staff contingency plan in the event of an outbreak.

Outcome

The Licensee submitted a plan to achieve compliance. RHRA to confirm compliance by inspection.
