

# FINAL INSPECTION REPORT Under the Retirement Homes Act, 2010

## **Purpose of Inspection**

The RHRA conducts compliance inspections as set out in section 77(1) of the *Retirement Homes Act, 2010* (the "RHA").

#### **NON-COMPLIANCE**

1. The Licensee failed to comply with the RHA, S.O. 2010, c. 11, s. 62; Persons who approve plans of care.

Specifically, the Licensee failed to comply with the following subsection(s):

- **62. (9)** The licensee shall ensure that the following persons have approved the plan of care, including any revisions to it, and that a copy is provided to them:
  - 1. The resident or the resident's substitute decision-maker.

### **Inspection Finding**

At the time of inspection, the Licensee was unable to demonstrate that all care plans were signed by the resident or substitute decision maker and that all care plans were approved by or supervised under a member of the College of Nurses of Ontario or College of Physicians and Surgeons of Ontario.

# **Outcome**

At the time of the inspection, the Licensee was not in compliance. The home has since taken corrective action to achieve compliance.

2. The Licensee failed to comply with O. Reg. 166/11, s. 27; Infection prevention and control program.

Specifically, the Licensee failed to comply with the following subsection(s):

- 27. (5) The licensee of a retirement home shall ensure that,
  - (0.b) all reasonable steps are taken in the retirement home to follow,
    - (i) any directive respecting coronavirus (COVID-19) issued to long-term care homes by the Chief Medical Officer of Health under section 77.7 of the Health Protection and Promotion Act,

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# **Inspection Finding**

The Licensee was not able to demonstrate they were following a directive respecting COVID-19 issued to long-term care homes by the Chief Medical Officer of Health by failing to continuously record environmental cleaning for high touch surface areas.

#### **Outcome**

The Licensee must take corrective action to achieve compliance.

3. The Licensee failed to comply with O. Reg. 166/11, s. 17; Cleanliness.

Specifically, the Licensee failed to comply with the following subsection(s):

17. (3) The licensee shall document the routines and methods used to comply with subsections (1) and (2).

## **Inspection Finding**

The Licensee was not able to demonstrate they are keeping accurate records of cleaning common bathrooms.

#### **Outcome**

The Licensee must take corrective action to achieve compliance.

4. The Licensee failed to comply with the RHA, S.O. 2010, c. 11, s. 90; Compliance order.

Specifically, the Licensee failed to comply with the following subsection(s):

<u>90. (1)</u> If the Registrar believes on reasonable grounds that a licensee has contravened a requirement under this Act, the Registrar may serve an order on the licensee ordering the licensee to refrain from doing something, or to do something, for the purpose of ending the contravention and achieving compliance and for the purpose of ensuring that the contravention is not repeated and that compliance is maintained.

# **Inspection Finding**

An inspection revealed the Licensee is in contravention of compliance order # 2021-T0245-90-01 specifically for failing to document environmental cleaning on all high-touch surfaces and common areas in the home.

# **Outcome**

The Licensee must take corrective action to achieve compliance.

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# **NOTICE**

The Final Inspection Report is being provided to the Licensee, the Registrar of the Retirement Homes Regulatory Authority (the "RHRA") and the home's Residents' Council, if any.

Section 55 of the RHA requires that the Final Inspection Report be posted in the home in a conspicuous and easily accessible location. In addition, the Licensee must ensure that copies of every Final Inspection Report from the previous two (2) years are made available in the Home, in an easily accessible location.
