Purpose of Inspection
The RHRA conducts routine inspections as set out in section 77(3) of the <i>Retirement Homes Act, 2010</i> (the "RHA").

NON-COMPLIANCE
<p>1. The Licensee failed to comply with the RHA, S.O. 2010, c. 11, s. 65; On-going training. The Licensee failed to comply with O. Reg. 166/11, s. 14; Staff training.</p> <p>Specifically, the Licensee failed to comply with the following subsection(s):</p> <p>65. (4) The licensee shall ensure that the persons who are required to receive the training described in subsection (2) receive on-going training as described in that subsection at the times required by the regulations.</p> <p>14. (2) For the purposes of subsection 65 (4) of the Act, the licensee shall ensure that the persons who are required to receive training under subsection 65 (2) of the Act receive the training at least annually.</p>
<p>Inspection Finding</p> <p>The Licensee was not able to produce all staff training records and to demonstrate that all staff received mandatory annual training.</p>
<p>Outcome</p> <p>The Licensee must take corrective action to achieve compliance.</p>
<p>2. The Licensee failed to comply with O. Reg. 166/11, s. 27; Infection prevention and control program.</p> <p>Specifically, the Licensee failed to comply with the following subsection(s):</p> <p>27. (5) The licensee of a retirement home shall ensure that,</p>

- (0.b) all reasonable steps are taken in the retirement home to follow,
 (i) any directive respecting coronavirus (COVID-19) issued to long-term care homes by the Chief Medical Officer of Health under section 77.7 of the Health Protection and Promotion Act,

Inspection Finding

The Licensee was not able to demonstrate they were following a directive respecting COVID-19 issued by the Chief Medical Officer of Health by failing to record resident screening twice daily, failing to record high touch surface disinfecting twice daily, and staff failing to wear appropriate PPE.

Outcome

The Licensee must take corrective action to achieve compliance.

3. The Licensee failed to comply with O. Reg. 166/11, s. 24; Emergency plan, general.

Specifically, the Licensee failed to comply with the following subsection(s):

24. (4) The licensee shall keep current all arrangements with community agencies, partner facilities and resources that will be involved in responding to an emergency.

24. (5) The licensee shall,

(a) on an annual basis at least, test the emergency plan, including arrangements with community agencies, partner facilities and resources that will be involved in responding to an emergency, related to,

- (i) the loss of essential services,
- (ii) situations involving a missing resident,
- (iii) medical emergencies,

(b) at least once every two years, conduct a planned evacuation of the retirement home;

Inspection Finding

At the time of inspection, the Licensee was not able to demonstrate the following emergency plan items including:

1. documentation the emergency plan is annually reviewed including contact information and agreements with agencies involved in responding to an emergency.
2. annual testing of their emergency procedures related to loss of essential services, missing resident, and medical emergencies.
3. documentation of a full evacuation every two years.

Outcome

The Licensee must take corrective action to achieve compliance.

NOTICE

The Final Inspection Report is being provided to the Licensee, the Registrar of the Retirement Homes Regulatory Authority (the "RHRA") and the home's Residents' Council, if any.

Section 55 of the RHA requires that the Final Inspection Report be posted in the home in a conspicuous and easily accessible location. In addition, the Licensee must ensure that copies of every Final Inspection Report from the previous two (2) years are made available in the Home, in an easily accessible location.
