Purpose of Inspection
The RHRA conducts routine inspections as set out in section 77(3) of the <i>Retirement Homes Act, 2010</i> (the "RHA").

NON-COMPLIANCE
<p>1. The Licensee failed to comply with the RHA, S.O. 2010, c. 11, s. 62; Assessment of resident. The Licensee failed to comply with the RHA, S.O. 2010, c. 11, s. 62; Reassessment and revision.</p> <p>Specifically, the Licensee failed to comply with the following subsection(s):</p> <p>62. (6) The licensee shall ensure that the plan of care is based on an assessment of the resident and the needs and preferences of the resident.</p> <p>62. (12) The licensee shall ensure that the resident is reassessed and the plan of care reviewed and revised at least every six months and at any other time if, in the opinion of the licensee or the resident, (b) the resident's care needs change or the care services set out in the plan are no longer necessary;</p>
<p>Inspection Finding</p> <p>The home was not able to demonstrate that the plans of care for residents were in compliance with the above noted legislation.</p>
<p>Outcome</p> <p>The Licensee submitted a plan to achieve compliance by August 12, 2021. RHRA to confirm compliance by inspection.</p>
<p>2. The Licensee failed to comply with the RHA, S.O. 2010, c. 11, s. 65; Training. The Licensee failed to comply with O. Reg. 166/11, s. 14; Staff training.</p> <p>Specifically, the Licensee failed to comply with the following subsection(s):</p>

65. (2) Every licensee of a retirement home shall ensure that no staff work in the home unless they have received training in,

(d) the licensee’s policy mentioned in subsection 68 (3) regarding the use of personal assistance services devices for residents;

(f) fire prevention and safety;

14. (1) For the purposes of clause 65 (2) (j) of the Act, every licensee of a retirement home shall ensure that all staff who work in the home receive training in the procedure described in subsection 73 (1) of the Act for a person to complain to the licensee.

Inspection Finding

The home was not able to demonstrate that all staff were trained in all relevant areas at orientation.

Outcome

The Licensee submitted a plan to achieve compliance by August 6, 2021. RHRA to confirm compliance by inspection.

3. The Licensee failed to comply with O. Reg. 166/11, s. 27; Infection prevention and control program.

Specifically, the Licensee failed to comply with the following subsection(s):

27. (5) The licensee of a retirement home shall ensure that,

(0.b) all reasonable steps are taken in the retirement home to follow,

(i) any directive respecting coronavirus (COVID-19) issued to long-term care homes by the Chief Medical Officer of Health under section 77.7 of the Health Protection and Promotion Act,

Inspection Finding

The home was not able to demonstrate that they were following all direction from the CMOH regarding active screening of staff.

Outcome

The Licensee advised they have taken corrective action to achieve compliance. RHRA to confirm compliance by inspection.

4. The Licensee failed to comply with O. Reg. 166/11, s. 24; Emergency plan, general.

Specifically, the Licensee failed to comply with the following subsection(s):

24. (5) The licensee shall,

(a) on an annual basis at least, test the emergency plan, including arrangements with community agencies, partner facilities and resources that will be involved in responding to an emergency, related to,

<p>(i) the loss of essential services, (iii) medical emergencies, (iv) violent outbursts; (b) at least once every two years, conduct a planned evacuation of the retirement home;</p>
<p>Inspection Finding The home was not able to demonstrate that all areas of testing of the emergency plan were being completed at the home.</p>
<p>Outcome The Licensee submitted a plan to achieve compliance by September 1, 2021. RHRA to confirm compliance by inspection.</p>

NOTICE

The Final Inspection Report is being provided to the Licensee, the Registrar of the Retirement Homes Regulatory Authority (the “RHRA”) and the home’s Residents’ Council, if any.

Section 55 of the RHA requires that the Final Inspection Report be posted in the home in a conspicuous and easily accessible location.
