Purpose of Inspection

The RHRA received a report under section 75(1) of the *Retirement Homes Act, 2010* (the "RHA").

NON-COMPLIANCE

1. The Licensee failed to comply with the RHA, S.O. 2010, c. 11, s. 65; Training.

Specifically, the Licensee failed to comply with the following subsection(s):

<u>65. (2)</u> Every licensee of a retirement home shall ensure that no staff work in the home unless they have received training in,

(a) the Residents' Bill of Rights;

(b) the licensee's policy mentioned in subsection 67 (4) to promote zero tolerance of abuse and neglect of residents;

(c) the protection afforded for whistle-blowing described in section 115;

(d) the licensee's policy mentioned in subsection 68 (3) regarding the use of personal assistance services devices for residents;

(e) injury prevention;

(f) fire prevention and safety;

(g) the licensee's emergency evacuation plan for the home mentioned in subsection 60 (3);

(h) the emergency plan and the infection prevention and control program of the licensee for the home mentioned in subsection 60 (4);

Inspection Finding

The Licensee failed to ensure that no staff work in the home unless they have received training as prescribed.

Outcome

The Licensee submitted a plan to achieve compliance by August 31st, 2021. RHRA to confirm compliance by inspection.

2. The Licensee failed to comply with O. Reg. 166/11, s. 13; Hiring staff and volunteers.

Specifically, the Licensee failed to comply with the following subsection(s):

<u>13. (1)</u> The police record check required by section 64 of the Act for a staff member or a volunteer working in a retirement home shall be,

(a) conducted by a police record check provider within the meaning of the Police Record Checks Reform Act, 2015;

(b) conducted within six months before the licensee of the home hires the staff member or accepts the volunteer to work in the home, as the case may be.

13. (2) The police record check must be a vulnerable sector check mentioned in paragraph 3 of subsection 8 (1) of the Police Record Checks Reform Act, 2015 to determine the person's suitability to be a staff member or volunteer in a retirement home and to protect residents from abuse and neglect.

Inspection Finding

The Licensee failed to have the required police record check for a staff member as prescribed.

Outcome

The Licensee submitted a plan to achieve compliance by August 31st, 2021. RHRA to confirm compliance by inspection.



NOTICE

The Final Inspection Report is being provided to the Licensee, the Registrar of the Retirement Homes Regulatory Authority (the "RHRA") and the home's Residents' Council, if any.

Section 55 of the RHA requires that the Final Inspection Report be posted in the home in a conspicuous and easily accessible location. In addition, the Licensee must ensure that copies of every Final Inspection Report from the previous two (2) years are made available in the Home, in an easily accessible location.
