

## FINAL INSPECTION REPORT Under the *Retirement Homes Act, 2010*

#### Purpose of Inspection

The RHRA conducts routine inspections as set out in section 77(3) of the *Retirement Homes Act, 2010* (the "RHA").

#### **NON-COMPLIANCE**

### 1. The Licensee failed to comply with the RHA, S.O. 2010, c. 11, s. 65; On-going training. The Licensee failed to comply with O. Reg. 166/11, s. 14; Staff training.

Specifically, the Licensee failed to comply with the following subsection(s):

**65. (4)** The licensee shall ensure that the persons who are required to receive the training described in subsection (2) receive on-going training as described in that subsection at the times required by the regulations.

**14. (2)** For the purposes of subsection 65 (4) of the Act, the licensee shall ensure that the persons who are required to receive training under subsection 65 (2) of the Act receive the training at least annually.

#### Inspection Finding

A review of the Licensee's training records revealed that the Licensee failed to ensure that all staff were trained annually, as required.

#### Outcome

The Licensee submitted a plan to achieve compliance by October 15, 2021. RHRA to confirm compliance by inspection.

# 2. The Licensee failed to comply with O. Reg. 166/11, s. 29; Administration of drugs or other substances.

Specifically, the Licensee failed to comply with the following subsection(s):

**29.** If one of the care services that the licensee or the staff of a retirement home provide to a resident of the home is the administration of a drug or other substance, the licensee shall ensure that,

(e) if the licensee or a staff member is involved in the administration of the drug or other substance at the home, that the licensee or staff member is trained in,

(iii) recognizing an adverse drug reaction and taking appropriate action;

(ii) the safe disposal of syringes and other sharps,

(i) ways of reducing the incidence of infectious disease, including maintaining proper hand hygiene.

(c) neither the licensee nor a staff member administers a drug to a resident in the home unless the licensee or the staff member has received training in the procedures applicable to the administration of the drug.

#### **Inspection Finding**

The Licensee failed to ensure that all staff were trained annually, as required.

#### Outcome

The Licensee submitted a plan to achieve compliance by September 15, 2021. RHRA to confirm compliance by inspection.



## NOTICE

The Final Inspection Report is being provided to the Licensee, the Registrar of the Retirement Homes Regulatory Authority (the "RHRA") and the home's Residents' Council, if any.

Section 55 of the RHA requires that the Final Inspection Report be posted in the home in a conspicuous and easily accessible location. In addition, the Licensee must ensure that copies of every Final Inspection Report from the previous two (2) years are made available in the Home, in an easily accessible location.
