Purpose of Inspection

The RHRA conducts routine inspections as set out in section 77(3) of the *Retirement Homes Act, 2010* (the "RHA").

NON-COMPLIANCE

 The Licensee failed to comply with the RHA, S.O. 2010, c. 11, s. 62; Plan of care. The Licensee failed to comply with the RHA, S.O. 2010, c. 11, s. 62; Contents of plan. The Licensee failed to comply with the RHA, S.O. 2010, c. 11, s. 62; Persons who approve plans of care.

The Licensee failed to comply with O. Reg. 166/11, s. 47; Development of plan of care.

Specifically, the Licensee failed to comply with the following subsection(s):

62. (1) When a resident commences his or her residency in a retirement home, the licensee shall, within the prescribed times, ensure that the resident is assessed and that a plan of care is developed based on the assessment and in accordance with this section and the regulations.

62. (4) The licensee of a retirement home shall ensure that there is a written plan of care for each resident of the home that sets out,

- (b) the planned care services for the resident that the licensee will provide, including,
 - (ii) the goals that the services are intended to achieve,

62. (9) The licensee shall ensure that the following persons have approved the plan of care, including any revisions to it, and that a copy is provided to them:

1. The resident or the resident's substitute decision-maker.

47. (2) No later than 21 days after a resident commences residency in a retirement home, the licensee of the home shall develop a complete plan of care for the resident based on the full assessment of the



resident's care needs and preferences conducted under section 44 that takes into account all of the matters that must be considered in a full assessment.

Inspection Finding

At the time of the inspection, a recent resident did not have a completed plan of care. In addition, the Licensee failed to ensure the reviewed plans of care included goals that the care services are intended to achieve. Furthermore, there was no evidence to support that residents or their substitute decision-makers had approved their plans of care.

Outcome

The Licensee submitted a plan to achieve compliance by October 28, 2021. RHRA to confirm compliance by inspection.

The Final Inspection Report is being provided to the Licensee, the Registrar of the Retirement Homes Regulatory Authority (the "RHRA") and the home's Residents' Council, if any.
