Purpose of Inspection

The RHRA conducts routine inspections as set out in section 77(3) of the *Retirement Homes Act, 2010* (the "RHA").

NON-COMPLIANCE

1. The Licensee failed to comply with O. Reg. 166/11, s. 32; Records.

Specifically, the Licensee failed to comply with the following subsection(s):

<u>32.</u> If the licensee or a member of the staff of a retirement home administers a drug or other substance to a resident, the licensee shall ensure that,

(a) the person who administered the drug or other substance prepares a written record noting the name and amount of the drug or other substance, the route of its administration and the time and date on which it was administered;

Inspection Finding

Medications are not consistently signed off when given to or refused by residents. Further, the Licensee is using pencil instead of pen to sign off on medication.

Outcome

The Licensee must take corrective action to achieve compliance.

2. The Licensee failed to comply with O. Reg. 166/11, s. 29; Administration of drugs or other substances.

Specifically, the Licensee failed to comply with the following subsection(s):

<u>29.</u> If one of the care services that the licensee or the staff of a retirement home provide to a resident of the home is the administration of a drug or other substance, the licensee shall ensure that,
(c) neither the licensee nor a staff member administers a drug to a resident in the home unless the



licensee or the staff member has received training in the procedures applicable to the administration of the drug;

(d) a member of a College, as defined in the Regulated Health Professions Act, 1991, supervises the administration of the drug or other substance to the resident in the home;

Inspection Finding

The Licensee is only staff member working in the home and is not properly trained in signing off on medication. Further, the Licensee does not have a member of a College supervising medication administration in the home.

Outcome

The Licensee has demonstrated that corrective action has been taken

3. The Licensee failed to comply with O. Reg. 166/11, s. 27; Infection prevention and control program.

Specifically, the Licensee failed to comply with the following subsection(s):

27. (5) The licensee of a retirement home shall ensure that,

(0.b) all reasonable steps are taken in the retirement home to follow,

(i) any directive respecting coronavirus (COVID-19) issued to long-term care homes by the Chief Medical Officer of Health under section 77.7 of the Health Protection and Promotion Act,

Inspection Finding

The Licensee is not actively screening individuals entering the home, including asking appropriate screening questions. The inspector found no evidence of residents being actively screened for signs and symptoms of COVID-19.

Outcome

The Licensee must take corrective action to achieve compliance.

4. The Licensee failed to comply with O. Reg. 166/11, s. 17; Cleanliness.

Specifically, the Licensee failed to comply with the following subsection(s):

<u>17. (3)</u> The licensee shall document the routines and methods used to comply with subsections (1) and (2).

Inspection Finding

The inspector found that the Licensee was filling out the monthly cleaning schedule as completed up to two months in advance, therefore it is unknown if or when cleaning had been completed as scheduled.

Outcome

The Licensee must take corrective action to achieve compliance.

5. The Licensee failed to comply with O. Reg. 166/11, s. 30; Storage of drugs or other substances.

Specifically, the Licensee failed to comply with the following subsection(s):

<u>30.</u> If drugs or other substances are stored in a retirement home on behalf of a resident, the licensee of the home shall ensure that,

(b) controlled substances as defined in the Controlled Drugs and Substances Act (Canada) are stored in a separate, double-locked stationary cupboard in the locked area or stored in a separate locked area within the locked medication cart;

Inspection Finding

The Licensee's storage area for narcotics is not secured or double locked. The container in which narcotics are stored is made of cardboard which can be easily accessed or removed.

Outcome

The Licensee must take corrective action to achieve compliance.



NOTICE

The Final Inspection Report is being provided to the Licensee, the Registrar of the Retirement Homes Regulatory Authority (the "RHRA") and the home's Residents' Council, if any.

Section 55 of the RHA requires that the Final Inspection Report be posted in the home in a conspicuous and easily accessible location.
