Purpose of Inspection

The RHRA conducts routine inspections as set out in section 77(3) of the *Retirement Homes Act, 2010* (the "RHA").

NON-COMPLIANCE

1. The Licensee failed to comply with O. Reg. 166/11, s. 25; Emergency plan, retirement home with more than 10 residents.

Specifically, the Licensee failed to comply with the following subsection(s):

<u>25. (3)</u> The licensee shall ensure that the emergency plan provides for the following:

3. Resources, supplies and equipment vital for the emergency response being set aside and readily available at the retirement home and regular testing of all such resources, supplies and equipment to ensure that they are in working order.

Inspection Finding

The Licensee was not able to demonstrate regular testing of the resources, supplies and equipment set aside and available for use in an emergency, as prescribed.

Outcome

At the time of the inspection, the Licensee was not in compliance. The home has since taken corrective action to achieve compliance.

The Licensee failed to comply with the RHA, S.O. 2010, c. 11, s. 62; Contents of plan.
The Licensee failed to comply with the RHA, S.O. 2010, c. 11, s. 62; Persons who approve plans of care.

Specifically, the Licensee failed to comply with the following subsection(s):



62. (4) The licensee of a retirement home shall ensure that there is a written plan of care for each resident of the home that sets out,

- (b) the planned care services for the resident that the licensee will provide, including,
 - (i) the details of the services,
 - (ii) the goals that the services are intended to achieve,
 - (iii) clear directions to the licensee's staff who provide direct care to the resident;

62. (9) The licensee shall ensure that the following persons have approved the plan of care, including any revisions to it, and that a copy is provided to them:

1. The resident or the resident's substitute decision-maker.

Inspection Finding

The plans of care for three relatively recent admissions were inspected. Of these, for one resident, there was insufficient information concerning the details of the specific care services, the goals the care services were intended to achieve, and the directions to the staff who were to provide the care to the resident were not clear. For two residents, there was no evidence that they had been provided with copies of their plans of care and it was unclear whether they had approved their plans of care.

Outcome

The Licensee submitted a plan to achieve compliance by November 27, 2021. RHRA to confirm compliance by inspection.

NOTICE

The Final Inspection Report is being provided to the Licensee, the Registrar of the Retirement Homes Regulatory Authority (the "RHRA") and the home's Residents' Council, if any.

Section 55 of the RHA requires that the Final Inspection Report be posted in the home in a conspicuous and easily accessible location. In addition, the Licensee must ensure that copies of every Final Inspection Report from the previous two (2) years are made available in the Home, in an easily accessible location.
