

# FINAL INSPECTION REPORT Under the *Retirement Homes Act, 2010*

#### **Purpose of Inspection**

The RHRA conducts routine inspections as set out in section 77(3) of the *Retirement Homes Act, 2010* (the "RHA").

## **NON-COMPLIANCE**

The Licensee failed to comply with the RHA, S.O. 2010, c. 11, s. 62; Contents of plan.
The Licensee failed to comply with the RHA, S.O. 2010, c. 11, s. 62; Assessment of resident.
The Licensee failed to comply with O. Reg. 166/11, s. 47; Development of plan of care.

Specifically, the Licensee failed to comply with the following subsection(s):

- **62. (4)** The licensee of a retirement home shall ensure that there is a written plan of care for each resident of the home that sets out,
  - (b) the planned care services for the resident that the licensee will provide, including, (iii) clear directions to the licensee's staff who provide direct care to the resident;
- <u>62. (6)</u> The licensee shall ensure that the plan of care is based on an assessment of the resident and the needs and preferences of the resident.
- 47. (5) If an assessment of a resident indicates that the resident's care needs may include dementia care, skin and wound care or the use of a personal assistance services device, the licensee shall ensure that an interdisciplinary care conference is held as part of the development of the resident's plan of care and that the resident's plan of care takes into account the results of the care conference.

### **Inspection Finding**

The Licensee was unable to demonstrate that all reviewed resident's plans of care had clear directions for staff for providing the care service of assistance with bathing. Further, two residents were identified as a falls risk; however, it was not identified in the resident's plans of care nor were the needs of the residents related to being at risk of falls. In addition, the Licensee was unable to demonstrate that interdisciplinary care conferences were held as part of the development of the plans of care for those residents whose care

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needs may include dementia care.

## Outcome

The Licensee has advised it has taken corrective action to achieve compliance. RHRA to confirm compliance by inspection.

The Final Inspection Report is being provided to the Licensee, the Registrar of the Retirement Homes Regulatory Authority (the "RHRA") and the home's Residents' Council, if any.
