Purpose of Inspection

The RHRA received a report under section 75(1) of the *Retirement Homes Act, 2010* (the "RHA").

NON-COMPLIANCE

1. The Licensee failed to comply with O. Reg. 166/11, s. 30; Storage of drugs or other substances.

Specifically, the Licensee failed to comply with the following subsection(s):

<u>30.</u> If drugs or other substances are stored in a retirement home on behalf of a resident, the licensee of the home shall ensure that,

(b) controlled substances as defined in the Controlled Drugs and Substances Act (Canada) are stored in a separate, double-locked stationary cupboard in the locked area or stored in a separate locked area within the locked medication cart;

Inspection Finding

While the Licensee did have a separate container for Controlled Drugs and Substances in the medication cart, it was not stationary or double locked.

Outcome

The Licensee must take corrective action to achieve compliance.

2. The Licensee failed to comply with O. Reg. 166/11, s. 36; Continence care.

Specifically, the Licensee failed to comply with the following subsection(s):

<u>36. (2)</u> If, as part of the continence care program, a licensee provides continence care products to a resident, the licensee shall,

(a) provide products that,

(ii) properly fit the resident,



(iii) promote the resident's comfort, ease of use, dignity and good skin integrity,

Inspection Finding

The Licensee failed to provide continence care and products that properly fit the resident, promote the resident's comfort, ease of use, dignity and good skin integrity by placing them in multiple briefs and putting plastic covers on their beds not designed for this use.

Outcome

The Licensee must take corrective action to achieve compliance.

3. The Licensee failed to comply with O. Reg. 166/11, s. 27; Infection prevention and control program.

Specifically, the Licensee failed to comply with the following subsection(s):

27. (5) The licensee of a retirement home shall ensure that,

- (0.b) all reasonable steps are taken in the retirement home to follow,
 - (i) any directive respecting coronavirus (COVID-19) issued to long-term care homes by the Chief Medical Officer of Health under section 77.7 of the Health Protection and Promotion Act,

Inspection Finding

The Licensee failed to comply with the directives regarding active screening protocol by failing to initiate screening and failing to ask appropriate screening questions.

Outcome

The Licensee must take corrective action to achieve compliance.



NOTICE

The Final Inspection Report is being provided to the Licensee, the Registrar of the Retirement Homes Regulatory Authority (the "RHRA") and the home's Residents' Council, if any.

Section 55 of the RHA requires that the Final Inspection Report be posted in the home in a conspicuous and easily accessible location.
