<p>Inspection Finding</p> <p>The home was not able to demonstrate that at the time of the inspection they were following all ensure that they were following any directive respecting coronavirus (COVID-19) issued to long-term care homes by the Chief Medical Officer of Health under section 77.7 of the Health Protection and Promotion Act, namely</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. They were completing active screening of visitors, staff, essential visitors and returning residents 2. All staff had completed training on IPAC protocols 3. Essential caregivers and support workers had attested to monthly review of IPAC training 4. They had not designated essential caregivers for residents 5. The home had an updated visitor's policy and a procedure to clearly communicate the policy to residents and families 6. They had developed policies on managing a staff exposed to COVID-19; masking of staff, visitors and residents; procedures for a resident returning from an absence
<p>Outcome</p> <p>The Licensee submitted a plan to achieve compliance by February 15, 2022. RHRA to confirm compliance by</p>

inspection.
