

# FINAL INSPECTION REPORT Under the Retirement Homes Act, 2010

# **Purpose of Inspection**

The RHRA received a report under section 75(1) of the Retirement Homes Act, 2010 (the "RHA").

### **NON-COMPLIANCE**

1. The Licensee failed to comply with the RHA, S.O. 2010, c. 11, s. 67; Policy to promote zero tolerance.

Specifically, the Licensee failed to comply with the following subsection(s):

<u>67. (4)</u> Without in any way restricting the generality of the duties described in subsections (1) and (2), the licensee shall ensure that there is a written policy to promote zero tolerance of abuse and neglect of residents and shall ensure that the policy is complied with.

# **Inspection Finding**

The Licensee reported to RHRA that an incident of resident-to-resident abuse had occurred. The inspector interviewed staff who witnessed the incident, as well as reviewed records of the incident in the home. The inspector confirmed that the Licensee's staff did not immediately report the incident to the General Manager or designate as required by their zero tolerance of abuse policy. The Licensee did not ensure their zero tolerance of abuse policy was complied with fully.

#### **Outcome**

The Licensee submitted a plan to achieve compliance by August 12, 2022. RHRA to confirm compliance by following up with the Licensee or by inspection.

2. The Licensee failed to comply with O. Reg. 166/11, s. 23; Behaviour management.

Specifically, the Licensee failed to comply with the following subsection(s):

- **23. (1)** Every licensee of a retirement home shall develop and implement a written behaviour management strategy that includes,
  - (a) techniques to prevent and address resident behaviours that pose a risk to the resident or others in the home;

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(b) strategies for interventions to prevent and address resident behaviours that pose a risk to the resident or others in the home;

# **Inspection Finding**

The inspector reviewed the plans of care for the two residents involved and found that the Licensee did not have clear strategies for staff, including triggers and appropriate interventions to manage and prevent further behaviours. The Licensee failed to document and implement behaviour management strategies as required.

#### Outcome

The Licensee submitted a plan to achieve compliance by July 31, 2022. RHRA to confirm compliance by following up with the Licensee or by inspection.

3. The Licensee failed to comply with the RHA, S.O. 2010, c. 11, s. 62; Persons who approve plans of care.

Specifically, the Licensee failed to comply with the following subsection(s):

- **62. (9)** The licensee shall ensure that the following persons have approved the plan of care, including any revisions to it, and that a copy is provided to them:
  - 1. The resident or the resident's substitute decision-maker.

# **Inspection Finding**

As part of the inspection, the inspector reviewed the resident care files and found that 1 resident did not have evidence of their plan of care having been approved. The Licensee failed to ensure that all resident plans of care had been approved as required.

#### **Outcome**

The Licensee submitted a plan to achieve compliance by July 31, 2022. RHRA to confirm compliance by following up with the Licensee or by inspection.

### **NOTICE**

The Final Inspection Report is being provided to the Licensee, the Registrar of the Retirement Homes Regulatory Authority (the "RHRA") and the home's Residents' Council, if any.

Section 55 of the RHA requires that the Final Inspection Report be posted in the home in a conspicuous and easily accessible location. In addition, the Licensee must ensure that copies of every Final Inspection Report from the previous two (2) years are made available in the Home, in an easily accessible location.
