Purpose of Inspection
The RHRA received a report under section 75(1) of the <i>Retirement Homes Act, 2010</i> (the "RHA").

NON-COMPLIANCE
<p>1. The Licensee failed to comply with the RHA, S.O. 2010, c. 11, s. 62; Contents of plan. The Licensee failed to comply with the RHA, S.O. 2010, c. 11, s. 62; Involvement of resident, etc.. (5) The licensee shall ensure that the resident, the resident's substitute decision-maker, if any, and any other persons designated by the resident or substitute decision-maker are given an opportunity to participate in the development, implementation and reviews of the resident's plan of care.</p> <p>62. (6) The licensee shall ensure that the plan of care is based on an assessment of the resident and the needs and preferences of the resident.</p> <p>62. (9) The licensee shall ensure that the following persons have approved the plan of care, including any revisions to it, and that a copy is provided to them:</p>

1. The resident or the resident’s substitute decision-maker.

Inspection Finding
A report was made to the RHRA regarding suspected improper care of a resident. As part of the inspection, in response to the allegation, the inspector conducted interviews as well as reviewed resident’s care files. The inspector confirmed that the Licensee failed to include the required content in the resident’s plan of care and include the resident in the development of the plan; as well, the Licensee failed to develop the care plan based on the reassessment of the resident. The licensee failed to include the resident in the development and approval of the care plan as well as include the required content based on the reassessment of the resident.

Outcome
The Licensee has advised it has taken corrective action to achieve compliance. RHRA to confirm compliance by following up with the Licensee or by inspection.

The Final Inspection Report is being provided to the Licensee, the Registrar of the Retirement Homes Regulatory Authority (the “RHRA”) and the home’s Residents’ Council, if any.

Section 55 of the RHA requires that the Final Inspection Report be posted in the home in a conspicuous and easily accessible location.
