Purpose of Inspection

The RHRA conducts routine inspections as set out in section 77(3) of the *Retirement Homes Act, 2010* (the "RHA").

NON-COMPLIANCE

1. The Licensee failed to comply with the RHA, S.O. 2010, c. 11, s. 62; Persons who approve plans of care.

The Licensee failed to comply with the RHA, S.O. 2010, c. 11, s. 62; Reassessment and revision.

Specifically, the Licensee failed to comply with the following subsection(s):

62. (9) The licensee shall ensure that the following persons have approved the plan of care, including any revisions to it, and that a copy is provided to them:

1. The resident or the resident's substitute decision-maker.

2. The prescribed person if there is a person prescribed for the purpose of this paragraph.

62. (12) The licensee shall ensure that the resident is reassessed and the plan of care reviewed and revised at least every six months.

Inspection Finding

The inspector reviewed a sample of resident care files and found one plan of care was overdue and another had no evidence of the necessary approvals. The Licensee failed to ensure the listed provisions had been fully met for some plans of care.

Outcome

The Licensee submitted a plan to achieve compliance by December 15, 2022. RHRA to confirm compliance by following up with the Licensee or by inspection.

2. The Licensee failed to comply with O. Reg. 166/11, s. 27; Infection prevention and control program.

Specifically, the Licensee failed to comply with the following subsection(s):

<u>27. (5)</u> The licensee of a retirement home shall ensure that,

(0.a) any guidance, advice or recommendations given to retirement homes by the Chief Medical Officer of Health are followed in the retirement home;

Inspection Finding

The inspector requested evidence to show temperature checks were being conducted for all residents as required by the guidance provided by the Chief Medical Officer of Health and was informed these were not being done. The Licensee failed to ensure all residents were assessed at least once daily for signs and symptoms of COVID-19, including temperature checks.

Outcome

The Licensee has advised it has taken corrective action to achieve compliance. RHRA to confirm compliance by following up with the Licensee or by inspection.

NOTICE

The Final Inspection Report is being provided to the Licensee, the Registrar of the Retirement Homes Regulatory Authority (the "RHRA") and the home's Residents' Council, if any.

Section 55 of the RHA requires that the Final Inspection Report be posted in the home in a conspicuous and easily accessible location. In addition, the Licensee must ensure that copies of every Final Inspection Report from the previous two (2) years are made available in the Home, in an easily accessible location.
