### **About Routine Inspections**

A routine inspection, performed by an RHRA inspector, is a physical inspection of a licensed retirement home. During a routine inspection, an RHRA inspector will walk through the home, speak to residents and staff, observe care services and conditions in the home, and ensure the licensee's management and staff follow mandatory policies and practices designed to protect the welfare of residents.

Following a routine inspection, the RHRA inspector prepares a draft inspection report which is sent to the licensee. The draft report may include instances where the licensee has failed to meet the standards of the *RHA*. If included, the licensee can respond to these instances and is strongly encouraged to inform RHRA of its plans to meet the standards of the *RHA*.

Following the draft report, the RHRA inspector prepares this final inspection report, incorporating any response from the licensee with their plans to meet the standards of the *RHA*. The most recent final inspection report must be posted in the home in a visible and easily accessible location. All final inspection reports from the previous two years must also be made available in an easily accessible location in the home. The licensee must provide a copy of this report to the home's Residents' Council, if one exists.

In addition to inspection reports, RHRA may provide information to a licensee to encourage improvements of their current practices.

If the licensee repeatedly does not meet the required standards, RHRA may take further action.

### **Focus Areas**

During a routine inspection, an inspector will focus primarily on a set number of areas which have been identified as related to the health, safety and wellbeing of resident, and may take various actions to determine whether the licensee is compliant with the RHA in relating to the areas. The areas listed in this section are ones which an inspector has identified as non-compliant.

#### Focus Area #1: Behaviour Management

### **RHRA Inspector Findings**

During the routine inspection, the inspector reviewed a sample of resident records. This review identified two residents as having responsive behaviors and the Licensee had not developed and implemented a behaviour management strategy that included techniques to prevent and address behaviours, strategies for interventions to prevent and address behaviours, and strategies for monitoring residents with demonstrated behaviours. The Licensee failed to implement their behaviour management policy.

### Outcome

The Licensee has demonstrated it has taken corrective action to achieve compliance.

### Focus Area #2: Resident Record, Assessment, Plan of Care

### **RHRA Inspector Findings**

As part of the routine inspection, the inspector reviewed a sample of residents' care plans. The inspector observed that existing care plans were missing the list of care services that are a part of the package of care services that the resident is entitled to receive. This was a previous citation. In addition, the inspector determined that two care plans were not based on an assessment of the resident in relation to behaviour management. Finally, the home failed to initiate an interdisciplinary care conference for a resident whose assessment included dementia care. The Licensee failed to ensure plans of care were completed in compliance with the legislation.

#### Outcome

The Licensee has advised it has taken corrective action to achieve compliance. RHRA to confirm compliance by following up with the Licensee or by inspection.

### **Additional Findings**

During a routine inspection, an inspector may observe areas of non-compliance that are not related to the standard focus areas. In these cases, an inspector may cite the home for these contraventions at the time of this inspection. In addition, an inspector may follow-up on findings of non-compliance from previous inspections. Where the licensee is unable to demonstrate they have come into compliance or maintained compliance, an inspector may cite the home for these repeat contraventions at the time of this inspection.
