<b>About Routine Inspections</b>
A routine inspection, performed by an RHRA inspector, is a physical inspection of a licensed retirement home. During a routine inspection, an RHRA inspector will walk through the home, speak to residents and staff, observe care services and conditions in the home, and ensure the licensee's management and staff follow mandatory policies and practices designed to protect the welfare of residents.
Following a routine inspection, the RHRA inspector prepares a draft inspection report which is sent to the licensee. The draft report may include instances where the licensee has failed to meet the standards of the <i>RHA</i> . If included, the licensee can respond to these instances and is strongly encouraged to inform RHRA of its plans to meet the standards of the <i>RHA</i> .
Following the draft report, the RHRA inspector prepares this final inspection report, incorporating any response from the licensee with their plans to meet the standards of the <i>RHA</i> . The most recent final inspection report must be posted in the home in a visible and easily accessible location. All final inspection reports from the previous two years must also be made available in an easily accessible location in the home. The licensee must provide a copy of this report to the home's Residents' Council, if one exists.
In addition to inspection reports, RHRA may provide information to a licensee to encourage improvements of their current practices.
If the licensee repeatedly does not meet the required standards, RHRA may take further action.

<b>Focus Areas</b>
<i>During a routine inspection, an inspector will focus primarily on a set number of areas which have been identified as related to the health, safety and wellbeing of resident, and may take various actions to determine whether the licensee is compliant with the <i>RHA</i> in relating to the areas. The areas listed in this section are ones which an inspector has identified as non-compliant.</i>

As part of the routine inspection, the inspector reviewed a sample of residents' plan of care. There is a requirement under the Retirement Homes Act that resident plans of care be updated as care needs change. The inspector found that one of the plans was not updated at the time the resident's care needs changed or every six months. Furthermore, there was no evidence of a care conference taking place for the use of a PASD as required. The Licensee failed to ensure the plan was revised and updated in compliance with the legislation.

**Outcome**

The Licensee has demonstrated it has taken corrective action to achieve compliance.

**Additional Findings**

*During a routine inspection, an inspector may observe areas of non-compliance that are not related to the standard focus areas. In these cases, an inspector may cite the home for these contraventions at the time of this inspection. In addition, an inspector may follow-up on findings of non-compliance from previous inspections. (b) the resident's care needs change or the care services set out in the plan are no longer necessary;

**s. 62. (6); Assessment of resident**

62. (6) The licensee shall ensure that the plan of care is based on an assessment of the resident and the needs and preferences of the resident.

**s. 69. (2); Restrictions on use**

69. (2) A licensee of a retirement home or an external care provider who provides care services in the home may permit the use of a personal assistance services device for a resident of the home only if,

**s. 69. (2), (e)**

(e) the use of the device is included in the resident's plan of care;

**Ontario Regulation 166/11:****s. 47. (5); Development of plan of care**

47. (5) If an assessment of a resident indicates that the resident's care needs may include dementia care, skin and wound care or the use of a personal assistance services device, the licensee shall ensure that an interdisciplinary care conference is held as part of the development of the resident's plan of care and that the resident's plan of care takes into account the results of the care conference.
