Fire Sprinkler Retrofit Program

Under the Ontario Fire Code, all licensed retirement homes are required to be equipped with automatic fire sprinklers by January 1, 2019. Requirement for Filing Your Accessibility Compliance Report

A reminder about Ontario's accessibility laws. If your business has 20 or more employees, or if you are a public sector organization, you are legally required to file a 2017 accessibility compliance report by December 31, 2017.

Universal Influenza Immunization Program (UIIP)

If you would like to provide influenza vaccine to your residents, and did not pre-qualify to participate in the 2017-18 UIIP, you may choose to:

1. Hire a health care agency to transport and administer influenza vaccine at your retirement home. Your local public health unit can assist you in finding a participating health care agency.
2. Arrange for each resident's primary care provider to transport and administer influenza vaccine at your retirement home.
3. Assist homebound residents with contacting their pharmacist to transport and administer influenza vaccine at your retirement home. Pharmacists may only administer influenza vaccine to a resident in a retirement home provided that the following conditions are met:
 - a. the resident is unable to travel to the pharmacy (i.e., homebound);
 - b. the resident is a patient of the pharmacist (i.e., resident is already receiving dispensing services from the pharmacy); and
 - c. the pharmacy is located in the same public health unit as the retirement home.

Please note that retirement homes can only store publicly funded influenza vaccine in refrigerators at their facility if they have pre-qualified to participate in the 2017-18 UIIP with the Ministry of Health and Long-Term Care.
