## **RHRA 2023 Fees Consultation**

RHRA presented the proposed RHRA 2023 fee changes and rationale to the RN and asked for their feedback.

RHRA will consolidate the feedback and seek the RN's approval of the documented feedback. This feedback will be submitted to the RHRA Board of Directors as part of the RHRA 2023 Fees Public Consultation. The feedback will be shared with the Ministry for Seniors and Accessibility (MSAA).

The RN was also invited to provide individual feedback via the public consultation on the RHRA website. A summary of all feedback will be given to the RHRA Board of Directors and the Ministry for Seniors and MSAA.

Questions from the Resident Network:

- How many beds are funding the RHRA?
- Where does government funding come from?
- You have responsibilities from the government, yet you receive no funding.
  Why is that? Is there an expectation that RHRA can be funded by the
  Ministry and does MSAA provide RHRA with any funding?
- Who is the supervising organization of RHRA?
- What is the deficit from operating expenses recovered from?
- Have your responsibilities increased since 2014 to account for a deficit you now have?
- Does the increase in activity include a similar increase in staff?
- Who asked that RHRA be created, government or retirement residences?
- What does "a person with a controlling interest" mean?
- Are life leases included in the fee consultation?
- Are all homes going to be informed on what to do regarding the public consultation?
- What is the fee increase, percentage-wise?
